

Copier Maintenance – For some reason, we are not getting billed for copier maintenance again.

Pastoral - None

Worship – Organist Salary – Higher due to Lenten season. Budget Report: We ended the month at 7.7% or approximately \$16,400 under budget. All of the major budgeted expense catego-

ries ended under budget for the month.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report: Almost as high as giving in March. Giving in April was third highest in 9 years. Year-to-date total is behind last year at this time by approximately \$6,000; and is the lowest at this point since 2016.

History of the General Fund Balance: While still negative, April's negative balance is half of what March's was!! This is the second month with an improving ending balance! This is the best ending balance so far in 2019.

Account Balances Report:

Building Fund - Reflects the month's regular donations and the monthly payment for the separate phone line in the elevator. Activity also included paying the remaining balance of the cost for the new hearing aid system.

Pastor's Discretionary Fund – Reflects the establishment of a new fund by Pastor Baker and a disbursement from it.

The Oil Fund – Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.

The Oil Fund – Church Emergencies reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue and the transfer of the balance at month end to the General Fund.

The Oil Fund - Missions reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.

A few days after Pentecost, the Devil asked Jesus, "What makes you think that this church idea is going to work? Who's going to do it?" Jesus replied, "I have given the job to Peter and the apostles." "And if they fail?" responded Satan.
