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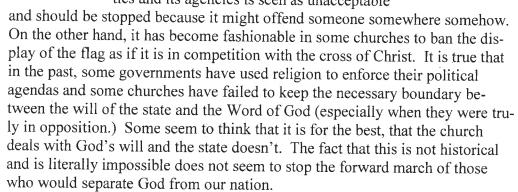

INTERDEPENDENCE DAY

In our modern-day America, the separation of church and state has come to mean that any hint of religion within our governing authorities and its agencies is seen as unacceptable



Though some may debate if our country's forefathers were truly Christian (all history seems debatable these days), the documents that they left us clearly show that God was expected to play a role in this new nation. They were clear that it was not the government's role to enforce the faith in a particular form, but the role of God was assumed in the nation that they formed.

For us, as Christians, the ideal of God not being active in government is not faithful to God's Word. Paul states clearly in Romans chapter 13, when describing governing authorities and the Christian's responsibility to them, that there is no authority except from God, and those governments that exist have been instituted by God (vs. 2.) With this understanding, Christians don't pay taxes because it is the law, but because it is a measure of our obedience to God. (vs. 7.)

For Luther, the difference between the church and the state was described as the two kingdoms, the two responsibilities. The task of the church is to be responsible for the spiritual welfare of the people. The task of the state was to be responsible for the physical safety and security of the people. One deals with forgiveness and salvation, the other with the power of the sword to protect the weak and ensure the common good. Laws cannot change people's hearts, only the Spirit of God can. The church cannot enforce faith with the sword (or new laws), but the sword is an effective tool for the State to provide justice for all.

Budget Report

We ended the month at 9.5% or approximately \$20,000 under budget.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

May had the second lowest giving in 2019.

Giving in May was second lowest in 9 years.

Year-to-date total is behind last year at this time by approximately \$8,000; and is the lowest at this point since 2015.

May's negative balance is almost twice as much as April's. All month ends in 2019 to date have been negative.

There has not been a positive month end balance since September 2018.

~~From Council Minutes for June 2019

For the last several years, we have ended the year in the red. We have been able to adjust this by propping up the regular giving with funds from other sources, but the reality was that we were not meeting our current expenses with regular giving. The problem with this is that those other sources may not always be available and we have become dependent upon them instead of paying our current needs.

Instead of just doing what we have always done, the council put off bailing us out of the red to see if we could do it ourselves. As you can see in the minutes above, it has not worked.

I am not sure that it is possible at this point to get ourselves out of the red, but I believe that the congregation deserves another chance to try and come closer. Like the fig tree, we have until the September council meeting to try. In reality, the bills will be paid

and ministry will continue, but are we setting the best example for our future? Will we be able to bear fruit "next year"? Can we do better?
