

At our September and October meeting a proposal for a change in serving at our meetings was brought. On motion, a small group wrote the following proposal.


NALCW NEWS - Please vote

Call to Order: President Jason called the meeting to order.

Devotions: Hollie lead us in devotions.

Approve Agenda: Motion to approve the amended agenda by Gene. Seconded by Rita. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: Don moved to approve the September Council minutes and the September 16th Executive Committee minutes. Seconded by Dean. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report:

Nick moved to approve. Seconded by Hollie. Motion carried. (Report on file).

Treasurer's Report:

Cash Flow Report

• Undesignated funds available to be used for September's General Fund expenses totaled \$15,935.17. This was a significant improvement over August! Certainly 5 Sundays in September helped. This amount also exceeded September's General Fund expenses totaling \$14,166.68 which helped to somewhat reduce the negative General Fund balance.

- Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$15,886.35. The monthly budget goal is \$17,651.60.
- Noteworthy Other Giving –
- o Miscellaneous \$1,000 donation was given for the Stained Glass windows.

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration – Church & Parsonage expenses – Due to timing, there were no expenses related to telephone, internet, and the fax machine this month. The second half of property taxes were due for the church, parsonage, and the parking lot.

Financial Secretary – Quarterly compensation was due.

Miscellaneous – Cost of the various lock services we received due to the recent theft.

Office supplies – copier paper, labels, postcards, and binders

Education – Due to a mistake in ordering SS materials, Ann obtained 2 years worth of teaching materials. After consulting with me, we decided to not send the wrong materials back as they can be used next year.

Budget Report

• We ended the month at approximately 15% or \$32,000 under budget.

All of the major budgeted expense

categories ended under budget for the month.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

- September had the best giving since April!
- It also had the third highest giving so far in 2019!!
- September 2019 had the second highest giving for a September in 9 years!!!

Nevertheless, year-to-date total giving continues to be behind last year at this time by approximately \$10,000; and is the lowest at this point since 2015.

History of the General Fund Balance

- All month ends in 2019 to date have been negative.
- Due to the higher giving in September, the negative General Fund balance was reduced slightly from last month.
- This is the second highest negative balance for 2019 to date.
- There has not been a positive month end balance since September 2018.
- All September's have ended in a negative balance except 2 in 9 years.

September 2019 had the second highest negative balance in 9 years.

Account Balances Report

• Building Fund - Reflects the month's donations

- HS Scholarship Fund Reflects a donation.
- Oil Fund Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue and the sale of two cookbooks. Previous anniversary expenses (including the cookbook production) were taken from this account due to a deficit balance in the Anniversary Fund.
- Oil Fund Church Emergencies reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue and the transfer of the balance at month end to the General Fund.
- Oil Fund Missions reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
- SS Outreach Fund Reflects the monthly donation to Compassion International and Sunday School offerings.

Stained Glass Window Fund – Reflects a donation.

Brovold Investment Valuation Report

After a large decrease last month, the balance increased by \$1,000 this month.

Gunderson Investment Valuation Report

- Highest balance ever!!
- Fourth month of increases in value.

Currently exceeds our original investment by \$3,300!

Yvonne moved to approve. Don seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor Report

Jason visited with Pastor Mike

Sletto. Pastor and Kim were meeting to discuss procedures for working together during this transition time.

Committee Reports:

Stewardship: No meeting this week. Stewardship Sunday went very well. Video was great. Bobbi's outstanding work was noted. About 40 people were at the Pot Luck. Love offering just over \$4200! Bulletin Board has been updated at the top of the steps. Education: Fire Extinguisher purchase will be taken care of by Don and Dean. Some smaller robes will be purchased for the younger children who are now going to be involved in the worship services. Hollie noted that we need some additional volunteer supervision for Released Time. Some of the classes are quite large and the teachers need some additional help.

Youth Group: None this week. Jim and Hollie will temporarily assist with some coordination for an activity or two for our youth during this transition time, but we are still very much in need of parental leadership. We ask that youth parents prayerfully consider this opportunity.

NALCW: Hollie reported.
NALCW met Oct 10. Lila had devotions and Mavis did Bible Study. Audrey and Dorothy sang. Mavis Finseth played piano. Group 8 served. \$4562.00 received from auction. A very successful evening! Hunter Supper is on Nov 9 from 5-8. Becky L. still needs more food items and some workers.

Serving groups are going through some revamping in regard to their meetings and serving. Nothing will change in terms of serving for funerals. Active members of the serving groups will be receiving a post card to vote regarding the structure and policy on the NALCW serving groups. Voting Option 1: Retain the current practice of a meeting for the ladies in attendance and following the program, the serving group responsible for the month serves a meal that is open to the public. Voting Option 2: Change the procedure from serving public meals following the ladies meeting to serving desert and coffee to those in attendance. There would be no public meal served anymore. The proposal will include a request that the active members would be encouraged to give a \$50 donation in lieu of serving.

<u>Trustees:</u> Don reported, and we thank him for all the extra work he has been doing.

Dead bolts have been purchased and will be installed soon.

Lighting improvements. Light fixtures (2 sets) have been replaced. There were two lights in the Narthex that were out, and one by the west wall that were fixed by Gene. He was able to replace them and match the existing fixtures. We thank Gene for the extra effort he took to do this job. Light replacements in the Sanctuary are pretty much completed, with only the one above the back bulletin bookshelf remaining to be fixed.

The hanging lights in the church will need some replacement lights since they have several burned out bulbs. No Boundaries will be called to do these replacements. A new kitchen stove is needed for the parsonage. Dean and Don will go shopping. They will also get a new fire extinguisher on this shopping trip.

Roof repair is complete. Roof was leaking all the way around the edge of the roof in addition to some leaks on the roof. All has been taken care of very professionally. The leak in the corner, at the head of the stairs, was also repaired. We must continue to monitor our roof to make sure that there are no other issues. Parsonage has some issues including: the furnace needs work, sump pump is not working correctly, some of the walls need to be painted and freshened up. The parsonage will be evaluated overall for updates prior to our getting a new pastor. Dean has volunteered to do some of the painting. Thank you to Dean.

Kim is going to order a safe from the office supply company in the range of \$200-\$250 to replace the damaged one.

<u>Deacons:</u> Gene reported. We had previously discussed advertising in the Valley Shopper and wanted to check on cost. Gene checked and advertising for the church would be free. Mavis has been helping with getting communion assistants and she has this covered. Rita and Gene began discussion regarding holiday ser-

vices. Decisions need to be made regarding the number of services and the need for service assistants. More discussion to follow.

Call Committee: Mary B. reported. Mary read a letter that will be published in the Scroll and be read in church. A minister has been invited to visit on Nov 16 & 17. This visit is a public visit and our worshipers will be able to meet this person and ask questions. A sincere "Thank you" was expressed for the outstanding work of our Call Committee. We are very excited and look forward with positive anticipation to this next phase of the call process.

Old Business:

Stained Glass Committee Mary reported that she is still in conversation with Marty Stone to see what the progress is to date. A bid has been requested.

General Fund balance We will try to continue as is until the 1st of the year and then make some decisions based on the 4th quarter.

New locks on office door Dead bolts on the Food Shelf door, office door, and door to the pastor's study will be installed soon.

New Business:

"Faith Comes By Hearing" Bible Sticks for Military Do we wish to support this mission as we have in the past. Hollie moved to support. Dean seconded. Motion carried. (We usually have presented this opportunity to the congregation around Veterans Day)

Parsonage overview by Jason

Jason did a walk through to get an overview of the condition of the

parsonage. We may want to update beyond what the absolute necessary fixes are. We should consider doing some upgrades that perhaps could be taken on by congregation volunteers. More discussion to follow.

Polk County Coordinated Victim Services Jason reported that the county court has contacted us regarding our losses from the break-in. One of the defendants is in custody and the other is still at large. Jason has requested the incident report for more information. Once we receive the report Jason will bring it to Scott for insurance review.

Furnace Room Gene brought up the condition of the furnace room. It must be cleaned because it is a safety hazard. We will add this need to the list for parsonage updates. We will be looking for volunteer assistance for these issues.

A THANKSGIVING REMEMBRANCE

My paternal grandmother lived with us. She would sit in the porch swing and I would stand behind her and brush her beautiful long gray hair. As I brushed her hair she would tell me her two favorite stories from the Bible. The only thing better was when she would have me snuggle up close to her in the swing as she read to me. As I child, I surmised that they were just good stories but now as a mother and grandmother I realize she had an ulterior motive - she was teaching me a most valuable lesson - a lesson about kindness and thankfulness.

She often added to the story of the Good Samaritan, "You never pass someone in need even if their skin is not the color of yours." And, "You should never pick and choose who you will be kind to, you just be kind," she would enumerate over and over.

This same instruction came with Manners and Etiquette. "Know what to do and do it. If you do the same right thing often enough it will become second nature to you." "That way," she would instruct, "You will always know

what to do and feel confident doing it."

Sounded complicated as a child but as I grew older I realized what I did automatically, others my age struggled with.

This tutoring soon gave me the understanding that the Kindness lessons and the Manners lessons were synonymous. They both really were practicing the Golden Rule. Which is simply put, "Treat others, as you want to be treated and never forget any kindness extended to you."

I also learned as a child growing up that my mother always had a slip of paper fastened to the inside of a cabinet door in the kitchen. It was near the sink where mother was more apt to see it. At the top of the page were written the words, "Lest I forget." There was never a kindness extended to her or our family that was not found listed on her paper. In November of each year she would in some way once again let the person or persons involved know how grateful she was for their kindness. Mother often quoted the reminder to us, "Don't remember the kindness you do for another, but never forget kindness done for vou."

I am reminded even more of the lessons learned as a child and even some days I find myself missing that spot on grandma's lap and the peace that came with her loving arms around me.
