Jesus Christ, Word made flesh, make a way for the Good News of your Kingdom to reach every home, every heart, everywhere.


Protect and preserve the labourers who courageously declare the glory of your Gospe! throughout the world. Provide for their every need and be their strength and joy.



**Call to Order:** President Jason called the meeting to order.

**Devotions:** Jason lead us in devotions about being content and living with gratitude.

**Approve Agenda:** Motion to approve the amended agenda by Gene. Seconded by Nick. Motion carried.

**Secretary's Report:** Nick moved to approve the October Council minutes. Seconded by Lori. Motion carried.

**Financial Secretary's Report:** Yvonne moved to approve. Seconded by Don. Motion carried. (Report on file).

#### Treasurer's Report:

#### Cash Flow Report

• Undesignated funds available to be used for October's General Fund expenses totaled \$19,156.23. This includes approximately \$4,800 in Love offerings. This amount exceeded October's General Fund expenses totaling \$12,027.26. This excess helped to significantly reduce the

This excess helped to significantly reduce the negative General Fund balance.

- Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$14,332.05. The monthly budget goal is \$17,651.60.
- Noteworthy Other Giving –
- o Love Offering \$4,815.00.

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration – Church & Parsonage Maintenance – paper towels, toilet paper, dish washer detergent, garbage bags, shop vac filter, and deadbolt locks.

Church & Parsonage utilities – Church electricity expense was less due to a previous credit balance. Due to timing, expenses related to telephone and internet were doubled up in October. The fax machine expense was for September only.

Financial Secretary – Quarterly compensation was due.

Miscellaneous – Cost of the various lock services we received due to the recent theft.

Office supplies – copier paper, labels, postcards, and binders

Education -

Miscellaneous – Renewal of video license.

Mission Outreach – Minkota Mission District – 2<sup>nd</sup> half of budgeted donation.

Pastoral – Interim Pastor – salary expense includes Pastor Baker's last paycheck and payment to Pastor Sletto for the month.

Interim Pastor – Health Insurance: health insurance premiums for Pastor Baker for November. I did not plan to make these payments for November, but the NALC benefits office told me I had to or the benefits program would get messed up for Grace in the future. They promised the church would get reimbursed in November once Pastor Baker got his paperwork filed for his new church. Interim Pastor - SS-MC: Includes expenses for both Pastor Baker and Pastor Sletto. Interim Pastor - Travel Expenses: reimbursement to Pastor Sletto for the month.

#### **Budget Report**

• We ended the month at approximately 18% or \$35,000 under budget.

All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

#### <u>History of Regular Giving to the</u> <u>General Fund Report</u>

- October's giving was down slightly from September, but was still fourth highest giving so far in 2019!!
- October 2019 had the fourth highest giving for an October in 9 years!!!
- Nevertheless, year-to-date total giving continues to be behind last year at this time by approximately \$9,500; and is the lowest at this point since 2015.

Balance does not include Love Offering.

<u>History of the General Fund Balance</u>

- All month ends in 2019 to date have been negative.
- However, due to the Love Offering and expenses being down, the negative General Fund balance was reduced significantly from last month.
- This is the second best negative balance for 2019 to date.
- There has not been a positive month end balance since September 2018.
- All but three October's have had a negative balance in the past 9 years.

October 2018 had approximately the same negative balance.

#### Account Balances Report

- Building Fund Reflects the month's donations as well as the expense for the separate elevator phone line for two months. In addition, the purchase of a fire extinguisher for the church (\$20), a new stove for the parsonage (\$700), and roof repairs to the Education Wing (\$6,950) were reflected.
- HS Scholarship Fund Reflects a donation.
- Oil Fund Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
- Oil Fund Church Emergencies reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue and the transfer of the balance at month end to the General Fund.

- Oil Fund Missions reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
- SS Outreach Fund Reflects the monthly donation and a Christmas donation to Compassion International and Sunday School offerings.

Stained Glass Window Fund – Reflects a donation and a down payment (\$824) to begin work on the project.

#### Brovold Investment Valuation Report

• The balance increased slightly over last month.

Highest balance since July 2019. Gunderson Investment Valuation Report

Down slightly from last month but still highest balance ever!!

#### Other Information

The trustees and I will need to meet before the December meeting to develop the church budget for 2020.

Hollie made a motion to approve. Lori seconded. Motion approved.

Pastor Report: No report to approve. Jason did have a discussion with Pastor Sletto regarding church services and his continued service to us. At this point, Pastor is willing to continue serving as originally agreed upon. We so appreciate him.

#### **Committee Reports:**

Stewardship: They did not meet this month so nothing new. Education: No report submitted.

Youth Group: Jim and Hollie met for the purpose of doing some temporary leadership for our Youth. They are going to try to revive the activities of the past except for the Mission Trip. They are going to try to meet with students and parents on December 11. We must have parent participation in order to have an active Youth Group in our parish. We have interested students. 5<sup>th</sup> guarter being planned for Dec 13 contingent upon help from parents. Hoping to do a sledding event, sleep-overs, concerts, etc. Planning to reach out to Vernes Church to offer Youth Group participation to them. Looking at "Feed My Starving Children" in April. Considering doing some Saturday morning nursing home activities. Going to try to help Tina with the calendar distribution when they come.

NALCW: Meeting Thurs, Nov 14. Rosilee Larson will sing. Joann will give Bible Study. Lyla will be the new secretary. Hollie will be the treas. Group 9 will be serving. Sherry H. will be putting together a Christmas Party for the ladies. There will be a \$5 gift exchange.

Trustees: Cleaning of the furnace rooms has been done and we thank Mary and Doug Bratrud. Furnaces are being worked on and we will get a full report later. Sanctuary lights still need to be replaced. We will need the parsonage interior repainted. Dean will do some of it and we will take care of the rest with others.



I am going to start this message by expressing gratitude. Thanksgiving & Christmas Eve worship schedule: Pastor Sletto said he could do a Thanksgiving Eve service, however we decided not to have one this Thanksgiving. We had low attendance last year and he is doing a great deal for us already. We will also have one service on Christmas Eve at 4:30. Lori made the motion to not have Thanksgiving Eve services, and to have one Christmas service at 4:30. Gene seconded. Motion carried.

Coverage of non-emergency visits. Gene will visit with Rita and Sheldon regarding their generous offer to help out. We will also ask for additional help if needed.

Possible sharing opportunities have been brought up. We do share the Youth Group and Released Time opportunities at this time. It was discussed that it may be a bit premature to consider a contract or parish arrangement at this time.

#### Announcements:

We received a solicitation letter from Pioneer Memorial Care Center. We will discuss Christmas offerings and how they will be designated. We will table this until next month.

Next meeting is December 11 at 8:00 p.m.







The anguish which had gripped her face vanished. She was radiant as we turned away from the house and began to walk up the hill together.


Just then her mother ran out into the yard. "Wait," she called. She must have been listening from behind the door. Tears were streaming down her cheeks.

#### **Emergency Closing Procedures**

#### **Grace Lutheran Church**

#### Introduction

The procedures in the this document have been developed and approved by the Grace Church Council to inform members of our congregation about what will happen in an inclement weather event or other emergency. Note that, no matter the written procedure, it is important to share the information you hear with others. Redundant information is better than missing information in an emergency.

#### **Sunday School**

The Sunday School Superintendent or designee shall be responsible for decisions about whether or not Sunday School will be in session. Once a decision is made, notification will be posted as follows:

Note that any decisions about canceling Sunday School must be coordinated with the Pastor or Church President so that notifications can be coordinated in the event there is an announcement related to the Worship Service.

#### **Worship Service**

The Pastor shall be responsible for decisions about whether or not to hold Worship Service during any kind of emergency. If Pastor is absent, the Church President shall make any needed decisions. If a decision is made that alters the posted worship schedule, notification will be posted as follows:

#### **Church Council meetings and Congregational Meetings**

The Church President or designee shall make decisions about postponing or canceling Council Meetings or Congregational Meetings. In the case of Council meetings, notification shall be made via e-mail and phone. For Congregational Meetings, notification will be posted in the same manner as for Worship Service changes.
