follow along with Pastor Mike found participating in the sacrament to be as meaningful as I did. We will do this exercise again.



I am confident in saying that the overwhelming sentiment is that just because some sort of in-person worship may be allowed, it doesn't mean it is the right thing for our church. We are fortunate to be able to deliver worship several different ways and have now figured out how to share Holy Communion from a distance. Our current situation will have to suffice for a while longer. Other churches with a different set of circumstances may make a different decision. I speak only about Grace Lutheran Church in Erskine. Keep in mind that when we do ultimately decide to gather as a group, we are asking a pastor and other worship aides to participate. It is not simply a matter of personal choice. Know and trust that I will work with the Council to find the right time for our church to again gather together for worship. I can't wait for the day that I can welcome everyone back to our sanctuary.

Finally, I will address the issue that I am sure is on the minds of many of our readers. That issue is, of course, the visit by Pastor Randy Conley. To make sure all members are aware of what the visit consisted of, here is a quick rundown. Pastor Randy and his wife Robbie met with church staff on Friday and had a face-to-face meeting with the Call Committee on Friday evening. Pastor and Robbie toured the parsonage and church on Saturday morning and had the first of two meetings with Council members at noon. We had to split up the Council to keep group size at an appropriate level. The second meeting with Council was over dinner on Saturday and the visit culminated with Pastor Randy delivering the message on Sunday morning. I think the visit went very well. I want to thank Mary and the rest of the Call Committee for their efforts over the weekend.

Where are we now? Well, the Call Committee and Pastor Randy are both in the midst of a period of reflection. If both parties are moved by the Holy Spirit to continue the process, the Call Committee will make a formal recommendation to the Council.



Treasurer's Report: Cash Flow Report

- Undesignated funds available to be used for April's General Fund expenses totaled \$12,107.63. This amount exceeded the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$8,668.55.
- Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$11,444. The monthly budget goal is \$17,957.40.
- Noteworthy Other Giving -
- o Miscellaneous: Majority was a donation of \$250 to be passed

through to the Grace Food Shelf.

o Thrivent Choice Program: Donations totaled \$654 all of which went to the General Fund.

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration – Custodian: Hours are less during this time, so he only submits his hours once during the month.

Copier Maintenance: No expense this month (not sure why).

Insurance: No expense due to timing of when premium was paid.

Various property taxes: First half on church, parsonage, and parking lots was paid.

Miscellaneous: End of year gifts for SS & RT teachers.

Mission Outreach -

Miscellaneous: Pass through donation of \$250 to Grace Food Shelf.

Worship – Organist Salary: Payroll taxes are from last month. Organist waived his monthly salary until we are back having regular worship.

Budget Report

• We ended the month at approximately 16% or \$34,400 under budget.

All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

<u>History of Regular Giving to the</u> General Fund Report

- April's giving was down slightly from last month and the lowest to date in 2020.
- This was the lowest giving for an April in 10 years.
- This was the lowest giving year to date since 2011.

This season of isolation has felt so long for so many. But I truly believe that one of the ways to strengthen our spirits is to look outside of ourselves. To spend some time praying for our neighbors, our leaders, and the children we serve around the world.

Below, you will find the latest update from Indonesia. I hope this update helps you as you pray for your sponsored child and as you lift up prayers for wisdom and guidance for the national leaders.

Indonesia

Compassion child development centers are closed until at least May 29. Workers are staying in contact with beneficiaries online and distributing emergency supplies, including soap, clean water, vitamins and groceries. Staff has created online lessons for children. Compassion health specialists are providing videos and flyers on disease prevention and hygiene.

Please continue to pray for those who are impacted directly by this pandemic. Medical professionals predict the worst may be yet to come for the developing world, which is far more underprepared for testing and caring for COVID-19 patients than we have been in more developed nations. This means tracking the full impact on our ministry, the children and their families will be increasingly difficult in the weeks and months to come. Our staff around the world have reported suspected and confirmed cases of COVID-19 among beneficiaries, family members, staff and frontline church members. We are doing our best to keep you informed of the effect this crisis is having on our ministry but always while respecting the privacy of those who serve alongside us. Thank you for your continued support and prayers.

Thank you for your continued love and support of Rangga during this time. It is truly a gift of hope and stability for him.

The Meaning Behind the 13 Folds of Old Glory

Most Americans have seen the traditional folding of the American flag, at specific events, such as funerals. Have you ever wondered why Old Glory is folded that specific way? Much more than just pomp and circumstance, each of the 13 folds holds special meaning.

The Flag Itself

The portion of the flag denoting honor is the canton of blue containing the stars representing states our veterans served in uniform. The field of blue dresses from left to right and is inverted only when draped as a funeral cloth over the casket of a veteran who has served our country honorably in uniform. In the U.S. Armed Forces, at the ceremony of retreat, the flag is lowered. folded in a triangle and kept under watch throughout the night as a tribute to our nation's honored dead. The next morning it is brought out and, at a ceremony of reveille, flown high as a symbol of belief in the resurrection of the body.

Meaning Behind the 13 Folds

The flag-folding ceremony represents the same religious principles on which our great country was originally founded.

- The first fold of our flag is a symbol of life.
- The second fold is a symbol

of our belief in eternal life.

The third fold is made in honor and remembrance of the veteran departing our ranks, and who gave a portion of his or her life for the defense of our country to attain peace throughout the world.

- The fourth fold represents our weaker nature; as American citizens trusting in God, it is Him we turn to in times of peace, as well as in times of war, for His divine guidance.
- The fifth fold is a tribute to our country. In the words of Stephen Decatur, "Our country, in dealing with other countries, may she always be right, but it is still our country, right or wrong."
- The sixth fold is for where our hearts lie. It is with our heart that we pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all.
- The seventh fold is a tribute to our armed forces, for it is through the armed forces that we protect our country and our flag against all enemies, whether they be found within or without the boundaries of our republic.
- The eighth fold is a tribute to the one who entered into the valley of the shadow of death, that we might see the light of day, and to honor our mother, for whom it flies on Mother's Day.
- The ninth fold is a tribute to womanhood. It has been through their faith, love, loyalty and devotion that has molded the character of the men and women who

who have made this country great.

• The 10th fold is a tribute to father, who has also given his sons and daughters for the defense of our country since he or she was first born.

- The 11th fold represents the lower portion of the seal of King David and King Solomon and glorifies the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.
- The 12th fold represents an emblem of eternity and glorifies God the Father, the Son and Holy Ghost.
- •The 13th and last fold, when the flag is completely folded, the stars are uppermost, reminding us of our national motto, "In God We Trust."

After the folding ceremony

After the flag is completely folded and tucked in, it has the appearance of a cocked hat, ever reminding us of the soldiers who served under Gen. George Washington and the sailors and Marines who served under Capt. John Paul Jones and were followed by their comrades and shipmates in the U.S. Armed Forces, preserving for us the rights, privileges and freedoms we enjoy today.


