"WHEN I SEE MY IMAGE IN IT"

The past year has been unpredictable, and for many has been tough. Globally, the days since the pandemic started are days of abnormal fear, panic, anxiety and hopelessness with a great effect on human health, financial security, social life and future goals. Fear, loneliness and stress have become common everywhere.

Spiritually no one is perfect in our lives and we are always under construction. Individual change is eminent when there is uncontrollable social and systemic change happens. So, my life during the pandemic is not indifferent. The past year were times when God has been molding and shaping me into the likeness of His Son, I can say. It was not easy but transforming. I said transforming because I have never been the same. Even physically I lost over 10 pounds. This all phenomena remind me an article I read a couple years ago from an unknown source.

It goes like this:

"A woman's Bible study was reading thru the book of Malachi when they read this: 'He will sit as a refiner and purifier of silver' (3:3). This verse puzzled them, and they wondered how this statement applied to the character and nature of God. One of the women offered to find out more about the process of refining silver and to get back to the group at their next Bible study. She called up a silversmith and made an appointment to watch him while he worked.

She didn't mention anything about the reason for her interest, beyond her curiosity about the process of refining silver. As she watched the silversmith work, he held a piece of silver over the fire and let it heat up. He explained that in refining silver, one needed to hold the silver in the middle of the fire, where the flames were the hottest as to burn away all the impurities. She asked the silversmith if it was true that he had to sit there in front of the fire the entire time the silver was being refined.



Call to Order: President Jason called the meeting to order.

Devotions: Jason chose devotions from Proverbs 31 Ministries. Subject Anticipation.

Approve Agenda: Motion to approve the amended agenda as presented by Ann. Seconded by Dean. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: Garv moved to approve the minutes. Seconded by Wade. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report: Yvonne moved to approve. Seconded by Gene. Motion carried. (Report on file).

Treasurer's Report: Cash Flow Report

 Undesignated funds available to be used for December's General Fund expenses totaled \$14,901.91. When factoring in previous months' special donations, this amount exceeded the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$15,427.14.

- Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$14,609.41. The monthly budget goal is \$17,957.40.
- Noteworthy Other Giving:
- o Miscellaneous A majority of this income consisted of donations to various church funds.
- o Oil Leases This income includes an extra oil company payment due to timing.

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration - Financial Secretary: 4th quarter payment.

Education – Education Director: Annual payment.

Mission Outreach - Miscellaneous: Pass through donations from the Deer Hunter's Supper, Love, and Thanksgiving offerings as well as pass through donations of the 2020 Mission offerings.

Pastoral – Miscellaneous: Related to visit by Pastor Tsena.

Worship - Worship Technology Supervisor: Annual payment.

Budget Report

• We ended the month at approximately 49% or \$104,000 under budget.

All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

• December's giving was the highest giving for any month during the year.

 However, this was almost the lowest giving for any December in 10 years.

This was the lowest year-end giving total since 2011.

History of the General Fund Balance

Balance continues to remain high due to decreased monthly expenses.

Account Balances Report

- Building Fund Reflects a donation made during the month and the monthly expense for the separate elevator phone line. In addition, it reflects work performed by Jack's Electric regarding the lighting replacement and repair in the sanctuary, wiring for the furnace and outlets in the sanctuary, and replacement of lighting in the basement (\$8,250). Monthly activity in this account also reflects the replacement of the doors in the narthex (\$7,629) by Thief River Glass and parts to changeover connections related to the replacement of the fuel oil furnace (\$123.41) by Fertile Oil Compa-
- HS Scholarship Fund Reflects a donation.
- Klatt Estate Fund Reflects equipment expenses related to the improvement of online worship (\$554.22).
- Oil Fund Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.

Education: Ann reported. Christmas Program was completed and it was very successful. Digital lessons started last Sunday as did Confirmation Class. Families are aware that decisions are being made month to month regarding SS.

Youth Group: No report.

NALCW: Hollie reported. They are not meeting these months so no report. Hollie will meet with Mary regarding plans when Mary gets back.

<u>Trustees:</u> Wade reported. Ryan will store the ½ pew that is still

Trustees: Wade reported. Rvan will store the ½ pew that is still in the Sanctuary until a decision is made about what to do with it. Will need to put some finishing repair on the carpet due to the pew that was removed for the AV equipment. Wade is checking on the white truck in the parking lot. Door has been installed but the finishing work wasn't complete. Brian S. came in after work and did the finishing work. Key access has not been discussed yet. Jack finished the lights downstairs. He will complete the work upstairs. Jack will write up the forms to get rebates from Ottertail. Jack was excellent to work with. Deacons: Gary and Gene reported. Pioneer Care Center requested 30 more communion sacrament packs for Sunday, Gary will deliver them.

Food Shelf: Gene reported. Food 15 families served on the second day this month totaling 1,510 pounds. For Dec. they helped 39 families (which is a record for a month) and 3,704 pounds of food. (also, a record) First distribution day they averaged 91.4 pounds per family, and 12/17 (2nd distribution day) averaged 100 pounds per family. Recognition given to Rose Koch a volunteer who has been very dedicated and is now leaving. Thank you Rose for all your hard work and you will be missed! Another freezer is being purchased. They have talked about putting it in the furnace room, but that is a bit warm.
