

## Interpretation of the "The Priesthood of all believers"

The priesthood of all believers is a foundational concept of Christianity. The exact meaning of the priesthood of all believers and its implications varies. So, its correct interpretation and applications are very important. Misunderstanding of the subject matter results in a misunderstanding of our Lutheran Liturgy.

The emphasis of the book of Leviticus is the appointment of the priesthood, with the statues and laws according to which the priests are to act and to teach the people. There we see that a priestly office is instituted only because of sin, to disclose sin to the people and to make atonement before God, so that its entire function is to deal with sin and sinners. Since God gave this law priests in ancient Israel acted as mediators between God and people. They ministered according to God's instruction, and they offered sacrifices to God on behalf of the people. Once a year, the high priest would enter the holiest part of the temple and offer a sacrifice for the sins of all the people, including all the priests. Lutheranism maintains this biblical doctrine of "the preaching office" or the "office of the holy ministry" established by God in the Christian Church.

Luther's study of the New Testament reveals the priesthood of all believers. His foundational concept of the subject is based on 1 Peter 2:5,9, which says; "...You also, as living stones, are being built up a spiritual house, a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light..." While Martin Luther did not use the exact phrase "priesthood of all believers," Luther concluded a general priesthood in Christendom in his book, To the Christian Nobility of the German Nation. He did that in order to dismiss the medieval view that Christians in the present life were to be divided into two classes: "spiritual" and "secular". Also, Luther, in his; On the Babylonian Captivity of the Church (1520) writes: "There are indeed priests whom we call ministers. They are chosen from among us, and who do everything in our

#### PAUL'S HISTORY CORNER

In 1892, plans were made for building a church. The members of the building committee were: O.T. Berge, J.S. Langhie, and H.T. Gilbertson.

Plans were for a structure 28x40 and was to be built on a corner, east of the Garden Valley Building. A Mr. Rasmussen and Mr. Holte were delegated to solicit funds for a new church and reported they had promises of \$203.50. It took several years to complete the church because of finances. It was completed for use in 1894.

name. That is a priesthood which is nothing else than the Ministry." Paul's first letter to the Corinthians 4:1 is considered to be the basis of this Luther's conclusion.

Everyone in God's household is a minister to everyone else. We are all responsible for the care, nurture, and growth of the household of God. Ordained leaders have a special responsibility to see to the preparation of God's people for ministries. We learn in scripture and by human experience that all of us are empowered and inspired by the Holy Spirit. The results are healthy and loving churches. Paul's letters in the New Testament are addressed to whole churches in different localities and contain an instruction (among other things) about the way Christians are to minister one to another and to the world. Paul seems to assume that all the people in a congregation, every member of the community, would heed his advice about mutual ministry.

However, we all understand that not all people are called to the office and our prayer is let no human pride and a self-righteous attitude block the work of the Spirit.

In general, it is wise to be guided by the Holy Spirit to do ministries in the biblical frameworks set by the Church.
