Grace".

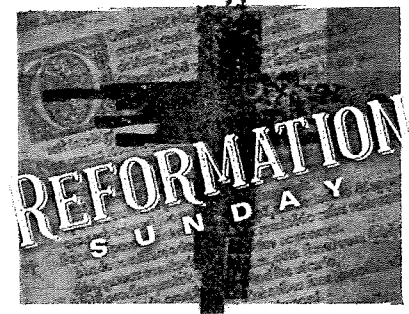
We currently have two circles available for any women of this congregation. These are not exclusive groups, and each have plenty of room for new members.

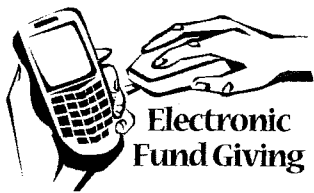

PAUL'S HISTORY CORNER

On Sunday morning, March 18, 1934, the interior of the church was completely destroyed by fire. It looked almost impossible and hopeless, but again God provided a way. Thomas Vol-lom, I.I. Stenerson, Anton Erickson, along with the church trustees A. R. Olsted, Louis Benson and C. Torbinson, constituted a committee with the charge of rebuilding our church. By September of that same year, the church was rebuilt much as before, with a few improvements.

Call to Order: President Jason called the meeting to order.

Hollie made a motion to accept John Carlson's nomination to the Board of Deacons. Motion seconded by Dean. Motion carried.

Devotions: Jason chose devotions dealing with guidance by Inspiration Ministries based on Isaiah 49 vs 10 & 11. How do we know which path to take as we face crossroads in our lives? We must seek and trust God to guide us. His word tells us that he promises to guide us as we move through our difficult times. We must pray about EVERY situation we face.

Approve Agenda: Motion to approve the amended agenda by Wade. Seconded by Lori. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: Gene moved to approve the August minutes. Seconded by Dean. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report: Yvonne moved to approve. Seconded by Gary. Motion carried. (Report on file).

Treasurer's Report:

Cash Flow Report

- Undesignated funds available to be used for August's General Fund expenses totaled \$12,904.55. This amount was only slightly less than the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$13,767.03.

- Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$12,895. The monthly budget goal is \$16,880.54.

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration – Church & Parsonage Maintenance: \$174.68 for parking lot gravel and \$78.30 for the striping of street parking.

Education – Miscellaneous: \$100.70 for 3rd grade bibles, \$207.92 for 7th grade bibles, \$113.88 for 12 catechisms, \$142.64 for renewal of video license (CVLI).

Pastoral – Health Insurance: Consists of monthly insurance reimbursement, State and Federal taxes on the July payment of the excess premium to date, and payment of all of Pastor Mike's expenses for August. Housing Equity: Three payments due to timing. Pension 403b: Three payments due to timing. Pre-Tax Retirement Contribution: Three payments due to timing. Roth Retirement Contribution: Three payments due to timing

Budget Report

- We ended the month at approximately 8.3% or \$16,700 under budget (one month's expenses).

All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

- August's giving was up nicely from July.
- It was the highest giving since May.
- Out of 8 months in 2021, it was the 4th highest.
- Looking back since 2011, this was the 2nd highest offering for the month of August.

- Year-to-date giving is nicely above last year at this time.

Otherwise, year-to-date giving is the third lowest in 11 years.

History of the General Fund Balance

- The August balance reflects a slight decrease from the July General Fund balance.

- This is the lowest balance so far in 2021.

The balance has declined approximately \$18,000 since the beginning of 2021.

Account Balances Report

- Building Fund - Reflects donations made during the month. In addition, it reflects

- HS Scholarship Fund – Reflects a donation.
 - Oil Fund – Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
 - Oil Fund – Church Emergencies reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
 - Oil Fund - Missions reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
 - SS Offering – Outreach Fund – Reflects the monthly donation of \$38 to Compassion International.
 - Stained Glass Window Fund – Purchased a street flag for Sunday School (\$99).
- VBS Fund – Reflects a donation and the purchase of snacks (\$20.42).

Brovold Investment Valuation Report

- The ending balance has been steady for the past eight months. Approximately 64% of the balance is currently comprised of cash.

Gunderson Investment Valuation Report

- The ending balance increased nicely from last month. This is the highest balance ever in the account!
- Jim met with Trustees to look into some of the insurance policies and valuations for parsonage and church.

We received a call from Ottertail Power Co. and they will be doing a commercial assessment for energy. They will give us a report and offer some suggestions. This is a free assessment.

Before Pastor left he asked that the Internet, phone and TV be disconnected. All could be done except for the TV because we need to evaluate reconnection costs and options with Garden Valley. Instead of a full disconnect we have put the TV on a 6 month pause. We also want to make sure that the phone number for the parsonage will be saved for us even though the phone is currently disconnected.

Nick made motion to approve. Wade seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor Report: Jason received a letter of resignation from Pastor Tsena. Pastor's letter of resignation was sadly accepted and we will continue to keep him in our prayers. We are grateful to have had him in our lives. We know that God is in control. Pastor Mike has graciously agreed to help us out again. Gary has talked to the Mission Dean and Jason will visit with Dr. Wendel regarding how we should proceed. Jason's recommendation at this time for moving forward is that we take time to heal and not start the process until next month. The Council agreed that Jason and Jim should be authorized to make employment contract decisions for Pastor Tsena, as become necessary, rather than pull the entire Council together for more meetings. Jason will

talk to the congregation on Sunday regarding Tsena's resignation. We were blessed by the time we have had with Pastor Tsena. We hope to have our options for how to proceed by our October meeting.

John made a motion to accept Pastor Tsena's resignation. Seconded by Nick. Motion carried. (Resignation letter will be on file in the office)

Committee Reports:

Stewardship: Lori reported. Love offering month is October and it has been decided to have Dorothy send cards with the current giving to the congregation. In the two prior years Jason has done a letter for the Scroll talking about Stewardship and he will do this again this year. Lori will give Kim the Love Offering envelopes for the newsletter by Oct 3. No Time & Talent cards will be given out this year. Council will be adding a "Welcome Strategies" category to our Committee Reports list on the agenda. We have not decided exactly how we will approach this topic but we feel very strongly about its importance. We want to make sure to discuss ways we can make our new congregation members feel welcome, feel needed and valued. We want to make a serious attempt to encourage confidence in all our members to become involved in Grace church. We will discuss this in more detail next month.

Education: Ann reported. SS we are set for Sunday with calendars, schedules, curriculum and some training for Powerpoint. We are set for the Rally Day for the backpack blessing and Bibles for 3rd and 7th, installation of teachers. Balloons will be purchased along with a bottle of Gatorade for each SS student in church on Sunday. Ann will put a "Welcome Back" on the Gatorade. At the end of the service Sunday each SS student will be given these treats. Balloons will be ready to be picked up Sunday at the Dollar Store by Lori. Confirmation needs to be dealt with. How will it be handled? When will it start? Ann has received calls from parents wondering about it. Released Time must be dealt with. Currently, we are missing one teacher for the 6th grade and we also need someone who is willing to supervise. Supervision would involve handling discipline, watching the halls to make sure all students are in class, being visible when students come from the school bus and when they leave for the bus. It would be preferred if we could get a pastor to do this. Having a supervisor is a very important position, especially in dealing with any liability issues, with students in our building. Teachers cannot be expected to take care of every issue with a classroom of students to teach. Ann has called more than 50 people and she has made contact with 8 area churches with no success to fill these positions. As of this council

meeting we have decided to have Released Time class for 1-5 since we cannot get a 6th grade teacher. We will also not be offering Released Time for our junior high students at this time, which is unfortunate.

Youth Group: Jim reported.

They are going to load the cans that have been collected on Saturday and would welcome volunteers.

WNALC: Hollie reported. Meet tomorrow (9/9). Having Tile Ink Coasters for the activity. Starting a new Women of the Bible for a study. Mary stepped aside as secretary last month and Becki Lindseth will replace her. Oct 6 set for the auction. Each group is asked to provide 2 pies and a man to work. Plans have started for a Deer Hunters Meatball Supper. Becki Lindseth has graciously agreed to chair this again. Last year, due to COVID, the supper was a drive through event. They had excellent response and Becki wants our opinion on doing a drive through again this year since we received such positive feedback. They sold out in less than two hours. Council decided to have a drive through again this year the first weekend in November.

Trustees: Wade reported. Requested an estimate to replace the sidewalk that's in need of repair. Discussing water softener needs and replacement. Dean will do the tuck pointing that needs repair. Received a resignation from Ryan Breitbach as a Trustee. We thank him for all of his service. We will need to

find a replacement. We have continued to have problems with young people who are unattended by an adult coming into the church as well as loitering on the church steps. We also continue to have difficulty with some adults coming into the church from different doors. Kim needs to know who is in the building. This is a liability issue and it needs to get solved. We will need to lock all doors except the door going into the SS wing that is visible from Kim's window during the day. When Kim leaves for the day all doors will need to be locked. We need to consider what we are going to do for security. There has been discussion about using a key card lock system. Further discussion will be needed. Dean is going to get the darker paint to match the brick for painting the foundation of the church.

Deacons: Gary reported. Welcome to John Carlson who will be replacing Mary Bratrud. They are going to check on who needs visitation and how to serve these members. A Youth Sunday was discussed again and we are very hopeful to get this going once a month. We want to include our young people in our service.

Video: Nick reported. Nick has no report on what happened to the sound on last Sunday. However, he has a new contact available for assistance. The Facebook and YouTube service worked just fine so we know the problem was not on our end. We must make sure our Sunday service live stream from Garden Valley is running

We do not have any of our hand-held mics yet. Nick will help Hollie get mics ready for the auction.

Food Shelf: Gene reported. Thank you to Shirley, Myles, and Judy for working Thursday. Also to Jareth Walk who was working to earn "in service" hours for Boy Scouts. 27 families served with 1,921 pounds distributed. Brought in 1,282 lbs. so they drew down the storeroom stock by almost 600 pounds. Averages of 71.2 pounds per family with 378 pounds per person were distributed. All food items are out of the parsonage garage and we have nothing at Groceries Plus. We so appreciate what Jason B did for us in giving of storage space. They are going to start issuing food vouchers again that can be used at Groceries Plus. Received \$500 from Winger Lions and another \$500 from a private individual. They brought in another 600 pounds of food today (9/8) so they are ready for the next distribution.

Old Business:

Education Building Roof. Lake Side Building-Erskine came over to evaluate the roof. They will give us a material list and cost estimate so we can make a decision. **Cleaning service (Maid to Perfection).** We still need to get a bid. Brian will do the handy-man work, but we need help on the weekly cleaning. Jason will try to get the contact info and get

a bid. Further discussion next month.

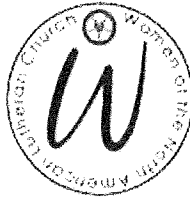
