Call to Order: President Jason called the meeting to order.

Devotions: Jason shared devotions from 1 Peter Chpt 5 starting with verse 2. As a council, we are here to serve. We are doing our best to follow our Mission and serve our Lord. God will give us strength and lead us in the right way.

Approve Agenda: Motion to approve the amended agenda by Gary. Seconded by Wade. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: Nick moved to approve Sept. minutes and the Executive Committee minutes. Seconded by Dean. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report:

Yvonne moved to approve. Seconded by John. Motion carried. (Report on file).

Treasurer's Report:

Cash Flow Report

• Undesignated funds available to be used for September's General Fund expenses totaled \$15,829.76. This amount was nicely above the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$13,612.71.

- Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$13,703. The monthly budget goal is \$16,880.54.

Budget Report

• We ended the month at approximately 10.9% or \$22,100 under budget.

• All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

All property tax expenses are over budget as actual expenses were higher.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

- September's giving was up nicely from August.
- It was the highest giving since May.
- Out of 9 months in 2021, it was the 4th highest.
- Looking back since 2011, this was the 5th highest offering for the month of September.
- Year-to-date giving is nicely above last year at this time. Otherwise, year-to-date giving is the third lowest in 11 years.

History of the General Fund
Balance The September balance reflects a nice increase from the August General Fund balance.

Account Balances Report

- Building Fund Reflects donations made during the month (including a portion of the anonymous donation @ \$30,000). In addition, it reflects expenses for the separate elevator phone line (\$39.24).
- HS Scholarship Fund Reflects donations (including a portion of the anonymous donation @ \$2,000).
- Oil Fund Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's

oil/gas revenue.

- SS Offering Outreach Fund – Reflects the monthly donation of \$38 to Compassion International. Also reflects Sunday School offerings for September and a portion of the anonymous donation (\$250.00).
- SS Fund Raiser Fund Reflects a portion of the anonymous donation (\$250.00).
- VBS Fund Reflects a portion of the anonymous donation (\$500.00).

Brovold Investment Valuation Report The ending balance dropped somewhat since last month.

Gunderson Investment Valuation Report

• The ending balance increased nicely from last month. This is the highest balance ever in the account!

Other Information I continue to work with the Trustees in reviewing the property and liability insurance coverages.

Nick made the motion to approve the report. Wade seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor Report: Jason reported. Jason asked if we had any questions regarding Pastor Mike and his taking on a more active role

as an interim.

We also want to remember Pastor Tsena and we want to make sure that he knows we are thankful for the time he was with us and we wish him the very best.

Committee Reports:

Stewardship: Lori reported. Love envelopes went out last month. They will have the report on that next month. Education: Ann reported. Started SS and Rally Day was fun. We are averaging about 35 students per Sunday. Visited with Pastor Mike about Confirmation and 1st Communion. Information regarding 1st Communion has been sent to parents. Ann is hoping to use the video screen more with the SS songs. The Shoe Box project will happening in mid-November. Youth Group: Ann reported. Sept 11, seven adults and five youth gathered up bags of cans. \$265.65 was collected.

NALCW: Hollie reported. Auction Sale took in over \$7,000. Earnings from quilt will go to DL shelter. Earnings from the sale of the tables will go to new furniture for SS. Tomorrow is aid. Mary B will do the Bible Study. Mavis Finseth and friend will provide music. Activity tomorrow will be to make notes, write on them, and send them. We received a Thank You note from Bev Hamre for the prayers when she was so ill. Will be discussing the Hunters Super tomorrow. If there is anyone who knows someone who is 80 in 2021 please let Hollie because they receive a devotional. Will be setting up a nominating committee for future elections. Will be asking for ideas with how to dispense the money from the sale.

Trustees: Wade reported. Received a quote for the sidewalk at \$12,226. Talked to Sand Hill-Ryan is done except for one part still on order for the air conditioning. Ryan checked the noise issue from the fan as issued and didn't find anything. Wade suggested if we hear it again when we are at church we should call Ryan right away so it can get checked out. Brian Stuhaug called asked permission to trim all the trees and bushes. We all agreed it should be done. Dean completed the tuck work—thank you Dean. Didn't get time for the painting of foundation this fall so it will be taken care of right away next spring. We are going to keep our water softeners because they would do a better job and do it more efficiently. Heat has been turned on in the parsonage at 50 degrees. Basement was dry when Wade checked.

Deacons: Gene reported. Talked about visitation and Gary came up with a list of names. Ann asked for the list too, so the SS could send cards. Gary thanked all who brought in coats for the Salvation Army.

Video Tech: Nick reported.
Things are going much better with our video broadcasts after GV did some rebooting of their equipment. Jim did talk to the Gen Mgr of GV to address some

OCTOBER COUNCIL, con't. of the broadcasting issues. GV is well aware of the issues and are addressing them. Nick also now has some clearance to reboot some equipment if there is broadcasting trouble on a Sunday. Ann asked if it would be possible for us to see the text for our songs on the screen. Nick will check into it. The rest of the equipment for the audio system should be here by December unless it gets pushed out again. (2 hand held mics and two over the belt mics are in this equipment)

Food Shelf: Gene reported. Thank you to Joette, Mary, and Betty for working today. First day this month served 9 families and today they served 15 families total 24. Total distribution for the month was 1,527 pounds. Per family served 63.7 pounds. These amounts are the lowest amounts of this year. Thank you to Mavis, Gene, Jim, and Dave L for working Truck Day. They brought in 861 pounds of food. September, they had 621 pounds for first pickup, 501 pounds from Grocery Plus, and then 861 this time for a total of 1.983 pounds of food coming in. Amounts are getting scaled back. Poundage down due to availability. They are planning for Thanksgiving boxes. Have an advisory meeting coming up next week.

Welcome Committee: No report Old Business:

Education Building Roof: Wade reported. Received quote on materials only for a pitched

roof from Lakeside Bldg. Prices will fluctuate depending upon the materials. \$70,000 to \$75,000 minimum total that would include labor. Materials bid was \$56,000. Skinner Roofing indicated that they could come and patch it, but reminded us that it could get very costly over time. They cannot give us guarantees. The question is: do we want a more permanent fix, or do we want to continue patching. The roof project will be discussed further at the November meeting. All materials will be purchased locally. Wade will get more information.

Cleaning service (Maid to Perfection) Wade reported. Wade and Gene both called some recommended people and were turned down. Maid to Perfection would cost about \$400 a month. They would come in once per week and do weekly cleaning and take care of some monthly projects. We were extremely happy with the deep cleaning they did for us earlier. We have decided that Maid to Perfection can meet our needs. Wade will call to get things started as soon as possible.

Key cards. Jason reported. We have a lot of ministries supported by the church so this would work well so different groups can get access to the building. Jason said Tri-Valley could print on the cards for us and we could get them numbered. The major cost for the project is the controller. We would like Jason to get us a quote. We decided we would have only one door that could be

accessed. John made a motion to have the trustees move ahead on the key access project and the sidewalk project, as discussed in the trustees report, as soon as possible. Gary seconded. Motion carried. Osland Construction could possibly do this the first week of November if weather permits.

New Business:

Approve ending of Mission Circle. The Mission Circle will be closing down after 100 years. Lori made the motion to approve their dissolving. Dean seconded. Motion carried.

Pastor Appreciation Month is October. Ann will arrange to get a card or poster together from the SS. We will give Pastor Sletto a gift card. We will give Pastor Mike the card in church and take the opportunity to publically thank him on Sunday Oct 17.

Investments: Jason just reminded us that we did decide to review our investments on a regular basis.

Worship in the Sanctuary:

Talk to pastor about formally receiving offering even without the plates. We need to have some kind of acknowledgment of offering that is received. Since the Covid numbers in Polk County are very high again we will continue to follow procedures that take the safer route for worship. We will revisit these issues every month and try to reinstate some of our normal


I have a couple of updates and a call to action for our membership this month. Our first update is that the council has decided to offer a second option for Holy Communion. In addition to the prepackaged elements (which will remain available), those who would like to come forward will be able to do so and will be able to serve themselves while assistants say the words we use during distribution. While the distribution is going on, Pastor Mike will lead those in the sanctuary and at home through Holy Communion with the prepackaged elements.

Our second update has to do with church security. We have decided to lock the church outside of business hours. There have been a couple of recent incidents, along with the theft from a couple of years ago, that have led to this decision. To facilitate the use of our church outside of times the office is open, we are installing a key card access system. That way, anyone representing a mission the council supports will have access to the church. The cards will be identifiable so we will be able to be relatively free in handing them out. We don't know who may have used a brass key but we will absolutely know what key card opened the door. Policy is being developed to support this change. The decision was not easy to limit access to our church. We may be able to amend the policy somewhat when we have a fulltime pastor but that is not our reality right now.

I'm going to close with a call to action. As I have said before. we need folks to be willing to serve on our council. The same faces cannot, should not, be at the table forever. Please thoughtfully and prayerfully consider serving on the council. Also, we are in need of members to serve on our next Call Committee. We should have a list of folks available for the council to send through to our Annual Meeting in January. If a term on the council seems like too much of a commitment, perhaps a stint on the Call Committee is more to your liking? Please let me or another member of the council know if you are willing to serve.

OUR WINCHURCH'S HISTORY

Over the years, Grace Church has raised up and supported many missionaries. Dr. Oliver Distad. who served as a medical missionary from 1918-1921. He died in China at the age of 37 as a result of typhoid. Clara Jones served in China for 17 years and Taiwan for 7 years. She has forever been woven into the fabric of the Lutheran Missionaries in China. Judy Hyland served in the Philippines, and through most of her time spent 3 1/2 years in a Japanese prison camp. Dr. Myles and Olivia Efteland served as medical missionaries to Taiwan and China. Theodore and Betty Homdrom served in South Africa for 35 years, and was many times under suspicion due to his objections to Apartheid. Russell Sanoden served in Japan for 36 years, Sharilyn Nielson-Walters along with her husband Mark served in Madagascar. Rev. Phillip and Margaret Luttion served in Japan for 37 years. We also supported missionaries in later years such as Kent Truehl and Dan and Cheryl Jore.

Grace WNALC Meeting – Thursday, November 11, 2021

Opening and Prayer – Attendance at the meeting was 14. Hollie Stewart began with a welcome and prayer.

<u>Devotion</u> – In recognition of Veteran's Day, devotion was conducted by Joanne Sannes with the reading of a true coming home story of Clifford Anderson (stepfather of Barb Gaalswyk) from August 1945.

Bible Study — Bible study was given by Mary Bratrud. The women of focus for the bible study were Rachel and Leah. Readings from Genesis 29:1-30, James 3:13-18, Philippians 2:3-4, Colossians 3:12-15, and Proverb 14:30. The study focused on competition, jealousy, deceit, and bitterness and the patience needed to follow God.

<u>Music</u> – An acapella singing of America the Beautiful, was done by the group.

Secretary's Report: - The secretary's report for the October 2021 meeting was read by Becky Lindseth. Motion to approve by Dorothy Sandberg, which was seconded by Joyce Voxland. The minutes were approved. A thank you cards from North American Lutheran Church and the students of the Win-E-Mac High School were read.

Treasurer's Report: - The treasurer's report was read by Barb Gaalswyk. Beginning balance was \$5,503.69. Deposits from auction and expenses leave a balance of \$14,945.40. Motion to

approve by Maxine Walter, which was seconded by Joanne Sannes. The treasurer's report was approved.

Old Business: Deer Hunter's Meatball Supper – Becky Lindseth shared 204 meals were served with the event being sold out at 7:30 p.m. Gross revenue totaled \$3,000.

Tillie Osland will receive the Garden of Truth devotion book.

Our son, Rhett, turned two yearsold recently. A few weeks before his birthday, a NICU nurse at Florida Hospital in Orlando (where our daughter was staying at the time) asked me how old Rhett was. I responded, "Oh, he's 23 months." "Oh, so he's two," she responded. I laughed and gasped, "No! He's 23 months, he's not two yet! I know that's practically two yearsold, but I don't want to age him any faster than I have to!" Although our son is only two yearsold, I try every single day to try to cherish and remember something about him. My wife and I love marveling over something new that he's learned that day, or a words that has learned to suddenly surprises us with, or a new means of playing with a toy that he wasn't capable of before.

Our home is a place of celebrating and encouraging our son, and now our daughter, because we know that one day they will grow up and seek out their own vision and purpose in life, and the best thing that we can do for them is to show them God's love as much as possible.

Joseph and Mary were Jesus' parents. They raised him in the same way that any other Jewish boy in Ancient Palestine would have been raised at the time. They helped him learn how to speak, how to read, and guided him in his adherence to the Jewish religion, such as observing all the feasts and customs of the time.

Joseph and Mary knew all the concerns and difficulties of parenthood, and carried that joy and burden with them throughout their lives.

Although most of the Gospel accounts depicts the three years that Jesus spent publicly ministering, in reality he spent far more time in his thirty-three years of life in the company of his parents. Luke describes this largely unrecorded childhood and young adulthood in 2:51-53:

"Then he returned to Nazareth with them and was obedient to them. And his mother stored all these things in her heart. Jesus grew in wisdom and in stature and in favor with God and all the people." We can only speculate about how much Jesus was shaped by his

parents. No doubt many of his perspectives and ideas were rooted in wisdom passed onto him by his parents, just as it is the same for any child. Joseph and Mary were divinely selected to raise God Incarnate, and we have to believe that one of the reasons they were picked is because of the unique love, devotion, and care that they would give him in his youth to fulfill his purpose and mission on this earth.

For those of you who are parents, or aspire to be parents, we can look to Mary and Joseph as role models. Their dedication and sacrifice for their child helped Jesus to grow up into the man he would become. If we want our children to make real, lasting impact on this world and contribute to the advancement of God's kingdom, then we too have to take on the responsibility of raising them in the lens of God's love and wisdom.

The best thing that we can do for our children is, like Mary and Joseph, to be followers of God, obedient to his direction, and willing to follow the mission of the Gospel in our own lives.

Lord,

I pray for each person who is responsible for the care and development of a child or youth, or stewarding the path of an adult who has since grown. There are many ways that we can foster the next generation, and it is humbling to know that you entrust us with their needs. I pray that you will strengthen all of us to follow your will as the caretakers of your children, and overwhelmingly convince us that your ways are best for us and our families. Amen.


