

Call to Order: President Jason called the meeting to order.

Devotions: Jason gave a devotion about wisdom. God gives us his wisdom generously. Ask God for his wisdom and think about what roles we have as church leaders to use that knowledge for the betterment of our congregation, and to follow the mission of this church.

Approve Agenda: Motion to approve the amended agenda by Gary. Seconded by Nick. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: Lori moved to approve amended May minutes. Seconded by Wade. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report: Dorothy reported.

Yvonne moved to approve. Seconded by John. Motion carried. (Report on file).

Treasurer's Report:

Cash Flow Report

- Undesignated funds available to be used for May's General Fund expenses totaled \$15,654.37. This amount was well above the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$11,773.38.
- Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$13,028.50. The monthly budget goal is \$19,160.69.
- Noteworthy Other Giving:
- o Miscellaneous \$2,238.19 from Garden Valley capital credits.

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Education: Bible Camp – Reimbursement for bible camp tuition.

Miscellaneous – Pass through donation to the youth group (\$50) and food for the last day of SS (\$42.03).

Mission Outreach: Miscellaneous - \$50.00 was passed through to the Grace Food Shelf.

Worship: Worship Aids – Renewal of online worship resource from Sola Publishing.

Budget Report

• We ended the month at approximately 13.2% or \$30,300 under budget.

All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month, with the exception of Mission Outreach due to previously discussed reasons

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

- Giving is down from last month.
- May giving is the third highest so far in 2022.
- This is the best year-to-date giving since 2018.

This is the fourth highest year-to-date giving since 2011.

<u>History of the General Fund</u> Balance

- The May balance reflects a nice increase from April's balance.
- The General Fund balance is the highest ever!

The May balance includes the \$25,000 CD.

Account Balances Report

- Building Fund Reflects donations made during the month and expenses for the separate elevator phone line (\$38.57) and sound equipment from Tricorne Audio (\$4,719.51).
- HS Scholarship CD CD was renewed in May. Balance reflects interest and additional \$3,000 added to the balance from the HS Scholarship Fund.
- HS Scholarship Fund Reflects a donation and a \$3,000 transfer to the HS Scholarship CD.
- Oil Fund Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
- Oil Fund Church Emergencies reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.

Michael J. Burns Architect~ Received the proposal from Mike Burns for formal architectural plans. (proposal on file) The plans he proposed were based on our list of wants/needs and what

some of these options would look at.

This plan includes the essential need of the roof repair. Additional suggestions that have been made include: Sunday School room renovation to address our changing room size needs, 150 person new space in the courtyard, emergency exit from the balcony.

This proposal would give us the professional input that we would be able to use for planning this project over the next year. We feel strongly about hiring an architect so that we get the professional expertise that would enable us to address meaningfully some of the additional wants/ needs.

Our roof is priority and is certainly a need. However, we need to be able to make educated decisions about our roof based on the variety of choices that we can possibly consider. We need to know what the footprint of our building will look like before we undergo the cost and plans for the roof. The roof project can be our window of opportunity to make some additional changes We must consider our long-term needs.

Prior to getting the proposal done is the question "should we propose the idea of a fellowship hall to the congregation to see if there is enough interest to pursue this suggestion with the architect?" This would change the footprint of our existing building.

Funds to pay for architectural

plans would come from the Oil Building Fund and Building Fund accounts..

Ann made a motion to solicit feedback from the congregation prior to establishing the scope of work with the architect. Seconded by Nick. Motion carried.

New Business:

No July Council meeting. Gene moved for no meeting. Gary seconded. Motion carried.
