Stewardship Sunday at Grace is October 9th. This is a time when we are reminded to think about the many gifts we have been given and to re-evaluate how we are giving back. Please thoughtfully and prayerfully consider stepping forward to serve or at least be open-minded if approached.

Thank you all for everything you do for our church. We are blessed in so many ways and cannot forget it. As we look forward to a new pastor coming to lead us, I hope we can offer her a fully seated Church Council to help her in a her ministry.


