

Call to Order: President Jason called the meeting to order.

Secretary's Report: Lori moved to approve Sept. minutes (no minutes for October due to no meeting.) Seconded by Wade. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report:

Treasurer's Report:

Cash Flow Report

- Undesignated funds available to be used for September's General Fund expenses totaled \$12,653.65. This amount was above the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$11,807.66.
- Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$12,368.00. The monthly budget goal is \$19,160.69.
- Noteworthy Other Giving:
- o Miscellaneous \$199.22 pass through donations to the Grace Food Shelf, \$50 pass through donation to the youth group, \$456 pass through donation to the SS Outreach Fund, and the balance was a pass through donation to the Scholarship Fund.

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration: Property Taxes – 2nd half for church and parsonage; none on the parking lot.

Financial Secretary – Quarterly salary payment.

Education: Miscellaneous – Pass through donation to the youth group (\$50).

Mission Outreach:

Miscellaneous – Pass through donation to the Grace Food Shelf (\$199.22) and \$600 to Minkota Mission District.

Budget Report

• We ended the month at approximately 27% or \$62,000 under budget.

All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month, with the exception of Mission Outreach due to previously discussed reasons.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

- Giving is down from last month.
- Second lowest month in 2022.
- This is the third highest year-to-date giving since 2011 (when I started tracking donations).
