**Call to Order:** President Jason called the meeting to order.

**Devotions:** Pastor Pam based devotions on Romans 1:1-7. How do these verses relate to us at Grace? Pastor asked for input from the Council. Thoughts that were expressed were: they remind us that we are all a part of what is to come, we have all feared that we will do something wrong but we all have been offered God's grace, all the missions that get supported by us around the world, we are all called to be servants because we have been saved and we are all unique, we all have gifts and how do we use them, apostleship and how that is all of our jobs done in different ways. Pastor Pam expressed we all should go boldly and be confident in our gifts. Verse 5 says we are charged with bringing others into the faith walk.

**Approve Agenda:** Motion to approve the amended agenda by Gary. Seconded by Wade. Motion carried.

Secretary's Report: John moved to approve October minutes (no meeting in Nov). Seconded by Ann. Motion carried.

#### Financial Secretary's Report:

Yvonne moved to approve. Seconded by Lori. Motion carried. (Report on file).

**Treasurer's Report:** Jim reported.

We are on track to finish the year very strong. Jim met with the Trustees about budget. Jim is very pleased with Ashley, from Ameriprise, for carefully watching and reporting back to us regarding our accounts.

#### Cash Flow Report

- Undesignated funds available to be used for November's General Fund expenses totaled \$18,654.13. This amount was above the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$14,560.25.
- Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$13,230.00. The monthly budget goal is \$19,160.69.
- Noteworthy Other Giving:
- o Miscellaneous Proceeds of Hunter's Supper \$2,937.00; anonymous donation \$2,151.65; Capital Credits from Red Lake Coop \$114.63; and pass through donations to the youth group, food shelf, the Scholarship Fund, the SS Outreach Fund, and the Shoebox Fund \$420.00.

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration: Church Cleaning

– Two months of cleaning

expense due to timing of bills.

Miscellaneous – Hunter's Supper expenses.

Office Supplies – copier paper, pens, postcards, staples, etc.

Mission Outreach: Miscellaneous – Pass through donations.

#### Budget Report

- We ended the month at approximately 32% or \$73,300 under budget.
- All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month, with the exception of Mission Outreach due to previously discussed reasons.

Another individual line item ended up over budget this month (church and parsonage fuel) and was considered when preparing the 2023 budget.

# History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

- Giving is down from last month.
- Year-to-date giving is significantly better than 2021.
- This is the fourth highest year -to-date giving since 2011 (when I started tracking donations).



## Holy Communion Study What is the magning and

- What is the meaning and purpose of the Sacrament?
- In what way do we receive God's grace?
  Study begins for youth and adults who are preparing to receive Holy Communion.

Age of First Communion varies within our Lutheran tradition. In general, we do Communion recognition and awareness at about age 9 or 10 or 4th grade. Pastor Pam will lead a 5-week course to prepare to receive Holy Communion. Generally, we ask that children express an interest in receiving the sacrament and that they are able to sit through and participate in the worship service before receiving Communion for the first time. 1<sup>st</sup> Communion will take place in the spring.

Talk with Pastor Pam to discuss the possibility, best times to meet, and to sign up.



Confirmation begins on January 11<sup>th</sup> at 6 PM. Note the time change. A parent or sponsor should be present for the first meeting as we discuss the proposed program and expectations. Confirmation classes are generally for 7<sup>th</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> grade.

The Confirmation Program at Grace seeks to empower young men & women to grow in faith by deepening their relationships with God, the church family, and their peers through worship, education, outreach and fellowship. Join us as we journey together.

The November balance includes the \$25,000 CD plus interest.

#### Account Balances Report

- Building Fund Reflects regular donations made during the month (\$20.00). It also reflects expenses related to the elevator inspection (\$125.00); separate elevator phone line (\$38.90); and painting expense for the parsonage (\$200.00).
- HS Scholarship Fund Reflects a donation (\$25.00).
- Oil Fund Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
- Oil Fund Church Emergencies reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
- Oil Fund Missions reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.

#### Other Information

At the end of November Jim met with the Trustees to develop the 2023 budget.

Nick made a motion to approve. Lori seconded. Motion carried.

#### Pastor's Report:

Pastoral care: Pastor plans to set aside a full day or two half days a week for visitations. Pastor welcomes the opportunity to have coffee with members if anyone wishes. Just give her a call at the office. Pastor visited Pioneer Care Center, visited David Hamre (Diane) who has been ill. Pastor has agreed to provide some services to Fair Meadow Nursing Home in Fertile due to the illness of Pastor Phil from Concordia Lutheran.

Education: Pastor Pam is proposing a three year program for confirmation. Setup is yet to be determined. Pastor will visit with Ann. Material choices will be discussed. Council is very supportive of her proposal. Pastor gave us a handout about a confirmation program. Pastor would like some feedback. She's used to using a 2 year program where 7<sup>th</sup> grade is a pre -confirmation time and then 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> confirmation. She would like feedback on what we think about this. Community Service is also built into this program. Confirmation will be on Wednesday evenings where there are less activities and more time for class.

The current 7:00 p.m. time will need to change for Council. Ann will ask the families regarding what time on a Wednesday is best for them and then we will decide on the Council's time. There is a Confirmation Retreat on Mar 3-5 that Pastor would like to take the students to. It is hosted by the LCMC in Alexandria. Would be a great opportunity for our students. For 1<sup>st</sup> Communion Pastor is planning to use materials that would entail a 5 week training session. She recommends the 4<sup>th</sup> grade level as a good time to introduce communion. Pastor is looking for guidance and opinions on this. Currently we are beginning at the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. Considering February to begin training. Worship: If there are going to be changes to our service setting Pastor will always include prep work giving the reasons for a

change. Pastor visited with Andrew regarding setting and hymn choices. They also talked about Lent and Easter Service plans. Pastor discussed assisting ministers that can be used during the service with reading, sharing specific prayers and other service related opportunities. Frequency of Holy Communion—Pastor's background is weekly communion, but if we choose to make the changes we will ask for the congregation's thoughts. John has the communion assistant list that the Deacons are responsible for compiling. Annual meeting might be a good place to talk about changes that are being considered.

They have received some very touching thank you notes from recipients. Gift cards were given to 19 teachers who do Sunday School and Released Time to show our appreciation for their service. Still in need of one released time teacher for 3rd grade. John can sub. Only 8 more afternoons for this school year needed. Please prayerfully consider this opportunity. Advent candle lighting. Ann needs a family to

light on Christmas Eve at 4:30. She will let Kim know who will be available. Sunday School is averaging about 36-40 students per Sunday. We are excited about this and we encourage more children to attend. All are welcome!

Youth Group: No report at this time.

NALCW: Hollie reported. The women don't meet from Dec -March. The program plans will remain about the same. NALCW contributed \$500 for donuts for pre-service coffee time on Sundays. Donation questions will be addressed and a resolution regarding procedure will be created and presented at a later date.

Trustees: Gene reported. They have been working on the budget for next year. Worked on some minor maintenance issues. Jason will talk to Mike Burns regarding building issues.
