Secretary's Report: Gene moved to approve March minutes. Seconded by Ann. Motion carried.

Financial Secretary's Report: Dorothy reported. (Report on file).

#### Treasurer's Report:

Fund expenses totaled
\$13,720.08. This amount was less than the month's General
Fund expenses totaling
\$19,615.29.

Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$12,780.00. The monthly budget goal is \$20,221.69.

Noteworthy Other Giving:
Miscellaneous – Consists of donations to the youth group and the food shelf, and reimbursement by the youth group for a meal after the FMSC event.
Thrivent Choice Program – Donations of \$162.00 was received through this program.
Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration: Church & Parsonage Fuel – March 2023 usage was 1,149.9 gallons and March 2022 usage was 810.3 gallons. Custodian/Salary – Three pay checks due to timing. Financial Secretary – Quarterly salary Education: Miscellaneous – Bible study for Ladies Aide Youth Leader Activities – Mileage and a meal for the group that participated in the recent FMSC event in Grand Forks.

Mission Outreach: Miscellaneous

– Pass through donations to
Grace Food Shelf and Grace
Youth Group.

Pastoral: Personal Compensation/ Pre-tax Retirement Contribution – This is three month's expense due to the delay in the establishment of the pastor's retirement account at Hahn Financial Group, Inc.

Worship: Worship Aids – Liquid paraffin quarts and wax remover. Budget Report We ended the month at approximately 4.6% or \$11,100 under budget. All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report March giving was in line with February. In comparison to giving for March in other years, this is the fifth lowest since 2011. Year-to-date giving is only slightly less than 2022. However, year-to-date giving is the fourth highest since 2011!

History of the General Fund Balance The General Fund balance is continuing a downward trend in March. The General Fund balance is down from February due to less giving and higher expenses in March. The March balance includes the \$25,000 CD plus interest. Account Balances Report Building Fund - Reflects regular donations made during the month (\$20.00). It also reflects expenses related to the separate elevator phone line (\$39.15), and the replacement of the parsonage furnace (\$4,510.00). General Fund CD – Reflects interest received (\$70.77). HS Scholarship Fund – Reflects a donation (\$25.00). Oil Fund – Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue. Oil Fund – Church Emergencies

Greetings dear family in Christ. We continue to spread Gospel among the people.

Do you remember my last post about Zhenya?

God started to bless him so much after he accepted Jesus as his own Saviour.

He got a reward from President of Ukraine. He also got free (very expensive) prosthesis and went through rehabilitation program. So he can walk now by himself.

Another miracle started to happen two weeks ago.

We started to promote a need about car for him and his family (They have 3 kids). God opened doors and two rich people from government donated a car for him. Now Zhenya drives 7 seats Mitsubishi. Car is 16 years old but still in very good condition. We took care about some things and now it runs perfect. He often says: "I was so

Last two packages....

During last year we spread couple thousands food packages to many refugees, elderly people, needy families... Each time when we help somebody we give them New Testament and share Gospel with them. I always try to spend some time with every person in order they can feel God's love and His care about them.

But this time it was very very interesting situation. I came to elder of one village. Her name was Maria. She was very thankful for the help to poor people. She told that often she bought food and cookies from her own money and helped to elderly people in her village. She gave me list of needy families. We prepared food packages and we started to drive from house to house and deliver packages to people. Two elderly ladies lived 6 or 7 miles from that village. We drove 40 minutes through dirt and mud and we cannot reach them that day because it was no road to get there. Local farmer plowed the road which went to 5 houses last autumn. 3 houses are empty for many years and in other 2 lived two ladies. The water, dirt and mud everywhere...

So next day I asked my friend Bogdan with horse wagon to get me there. We drove 1 hour 20 minutes one way and near 2 hours on the way back. When I came to first lady, her name is Stepania. She sayed: "You came from God. Only He could

She started to read it with tears.

We drove another couple miles and get to second lady. The second's lady name is Stefania (only one letter difference between these two ladies names). She was very glad to see us but she started to say: "In my 86 years nobody gave me anything for free. I have some potatoes and apples. I wish to change them for your food". We started to say to her: "God loves you and He gives you all these things for free". She replied: "When I was able to walk for longer distances. I was coming to Orthodox church. And I always needed there to pay for something. So even God wants money from me!"

So we started to explain her the Gospel and shared that God gave His Son in order to forgive our sins. God is not looking for our money.
