PASTOR'S CORNER

Psalm 100 is one of my favorite psalms. ¹ Shout for joy to the LORD, all the earth. ² Worship the LORD with gladness; come before him with joyful songs. ³ Know that the LORD is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the

sheep of his pasture. ⁴ Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. ⁵ For the LORD is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

Here we are enjoying the summer sun and temperately warm weather. I wonder that around here we have a tremendous appreciation of God's great gift of summer that others in warm climates take for granted. I can vouch for that having left our Kentucky home of 28 years with its **long hot** summers. It is easy to take the good things for granted. We tend to forget that the Almighty is the source of it all. Giving thanks turns our attention from the negative things and gives us hope that things will get better. There is always something good to thank God for. Thanks goes along with praise. Praise lifts us to another realm, the heavenly realm and out of our doldrums. We shout for joy when something good happens to us like winning a game or at the birth of a baby. The earth shouts as creation blooms before us in the flowers and crops. We can too. Worship our Lord Jesus in joy. Worship isn't supposed to be a dull duty. It's supposed to be a joyful gift we give to our God who lifts us into the heavenly realm as we do.

What we do need to know is that God loves us and gives good gifts to his children. Knowing Jesus is belonging. This psalm calls us to know God and all the goodness that He is. We have this place of belonging in his pasture and in his courtyard.

Remember that God doesn't stop loving us and is faithful forever. I have learned to give thanks even for the not so good things. One of my sons came home from elementary school with an itchy head. As he was combing his hair after a bath, I discovered the culprit – you guessed it – lice. We were in Germany with nowhere to buy anything to treat it since it was evening. So, there we went to the kitchen where I picked out all the nits. It wasn't much fun, but what caught my attention was a picture I had on the wall. *In everything give thanks. 1 Thessalonians* 5:18. Well, that was a challenge. But I took it on deciding that it gave us a chance to visit and make it a special time of sharing.

That may be simple, but it's a good place to start and carries over to the harder



We ended the month at approximately 7.6% or \$18,500 under budget. All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

April giving was up nicely from March. April had the best giving so far in 2023! In comparison to giving for April in other years, this is the fifth lowest since 2011. Year-to-date giving is only slightly less than 2022. However, year-to-date giving is the fourth highest since 2011!

Athanasian Creed

Whoever wants to be saved should above all cling to the catholic faith. Whoever does not guard it whole and inviolable will doubtless perish eternally. Now this is the catholic faith:

We worship one God in trinity and the Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the divine being. For the Father is one person, the Son is another, and the Spirit is still another. But the deity of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory, coeternal in majesty. What the Father is, the Son is, and so is the Holy Spirit.

Uncreated is the Father; uncreated is the Son; uncreated is the Spirit. The Father is infinite; the Son is infinite; the Holy Spirit is infinite. Eternal is the Father; eternal is the Son; eternal is the Spirit: And yet there are not three eternal beings, but one who is eternal; as there are not three uncreated and unlimited beings, but one who is uncreated and unlimited. Almighty is the Father; almighty is the Son; almighty is the Spirit: And yet there are not three almighty beings, but one who is almighty.

Thus the Father is God; the Son is God; the Holy Spirit is God: And yet there are not three gods, but one God. Thus the Father is Lord; the Son is Lord; the Holy Spirit is Lord: And yet there are not three lords, but one Lord. As Christian truth compels us to acknowledge each distinct per-

son as God and Lord, so catholic religion forbids us to say that there are three gods or lords.

The Father was neither made no created nor begotten; the Son was neither made nor created, but was alone begotten of the Father; the Spirit was neither made nor created, but is proceeding from the Father and the Son. Thus there is one Father, not three fathers; one Son, not three sons; one Holy Spirit, not three spirits. And in this Trinity, no one is before or after, greater or less than the other; but all three persons are in themselves, coeternal and coequal; and so we must worship the Trinity in unity and the one God in three per-

Whoever wants to be saved should think thus about the Trinity.

It is necessary for eternal salvation that one also faithfully believe that our Lord Jesus became flesh.

For this is the true faith that we believe and confess: That our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man. He is God, begotten before all worlds from the being of the Father, and he is man, born in the world from the being of his mother— existing fully as God, and fully as man with a rational soul and a human body; equal to the Father in divinity, subordinate to the Father in humanity.

Although he is God and man, he is not divided, but is one Christ. He is united because God has

taken humanity into himself; he does not transform deity into humanity. He is completely one in the unity of his person, without confusing his natures. For as the rational soul and body are one person, so the one Christ is God and man.

He suffered death for our salvation. He descended into hell and rose again from the dead. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

At his coming all people shall rise bodily to give an account of their own deeds. Those who have done good will enter eternal life, those who have done evil will enter eternal fire.

This is the catholic faith. One cannot be saved without believing this firmly and faithfully.

What Do You Want?

One of the best-known and mostbeloved psalms is Psalm 23, the "Shepherd Psalm." There we learn that the Lord is our Shepherd. And since He is our Shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our Shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord. our Shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we actually suffer from want, that the Lord, our Shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.

When do we live as though the Lord is not our Shepherd? When we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiving His gifts in church on Sunday (in violation of the First and Third Commandments). When we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we don't know what the future will bring (even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pastures and still waters). We live as though we are not the

Lord's sheep when we think that the Lord is only in the business of helping those who will help

themselves. We act this way because our minds are set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We act this way because we have stopped hearing the call of our Shepherd, which comes through His Word.

Through the Word of God, the Shepherd calls us to Himself. Through the Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through the Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead us to our true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the Good News: the Lord is your Shepherd, even and especially for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the Shepherd who lays down His life for His sheep. The Lord is your Shepherd. Let us live as His sheep.

Savings account: As of April 7, 2023, Balance \$27, 362.81. CD account - Balance \$25,081.92. CD due soon, and Jim will try to renew at a 4% or more interest. Last meeting there was a discussion of the Movement of monies to a higher rate savings account. Jim reported he and Mavis discussed that \$10,000 be drawn from the regular savings account and placed at the Ultima Bank at the interest rate of 2.9%. Grant Status report: Minnesota Foodshare Yearly-Monies were used and the final report sent in. Hunger Solutions-American Rescue Plan Food Support Plan (ARPA)-Final report sent in March, 2023. Minnesota Emergency Response Grant-The \$5000 can be used starting May 1st.
