



Financial Secretary's Report: Received.

Treasurer's Report: Jim reported.

Cash Flow Report Undesignated funds available to be used for June's General Fund expenses: \$13,150.02. General Fund expenses: \$13,827.56. Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$12,805.00. *The monthly budget goal is* \$20,221.69.

Noteworthy Other Giving: Miscellaneous – Reimbursement by NALCW for bible study materials (\$81.30) and pass through donations to the youth group and food shelf (\$100.00).

Some expenses this month included:

Administration: Church Utilities/ Internet Service – The higher cost reflects an increase in the internet speed since last month.

Custodian – Three pay periods in June due to timing.

Financial Secretary – quarterly salary payment.

Miscellaneous – Carnations for Mother's Day (\$150.00) and educational materials related to church committees, leadership, and HR (\$58.04).

Office Expenses/Postage – Renewal of annual fee for PO box (\$94.00) and postage for newsletter (\$99.64).

Mission Outreach:

Miscellaneous – Pass through donations to Grace Food Shelf and Grace Youth Group.

Pastoral: Housing Equity – Only half due to timing. Pension – 403 (b) – Only half due to timing. Pretax retirement Contribution – Only half due to timing

Worship: Worship Aids – Olive wood communion cups for 1st Communion students (\$39.63); communion cups for homebound members and music (\$87.75); and for altar (\$10.81).

Budget Report

We ended the month at approximately 10.2% or \$24,800 under budget. All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report

June giving was up from May. June giving was the third highest so far in 2023!

In comparison to giving for June in other years, this is the 3rd highest since 2011.

Year-to-date giving is approximately \$2,600 less than 2022.

History of the General Fund Balance

The General Fund balance decreased only slightly from May due to undesignated giving almost matching the monthly expenses. The June balance includes the \$25,000 CD plus interest.

inside out. It is not a process of magic whereby we get God to do what we ask. It is praying, "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

The most common idea of Christian Healing is seen as the healing of the body. While it is the focus of most healing, it is only a part of the scheme of wholeness that God intends for His people. We must hold physical healing as one part of the total ministry of healing to which He has called us. While it is an important part of healing, it is just a part.

Christian Healing is the manifestation of the creative power of God's love as He comes to make us a new creation in Christ Jesus. It is concerned not only with the stewardship of our body of flesh and blood. It is concerned with our ultimate relationship with God as our Father, Jesus Christ as our Savior and Healer, and Holy Spirit, as the Executive of Father's will for us as He revealed it in Jesus Christ.

It is not simply the maintenance of life in this world, but the growing edge of God's creation where the Kingdom of God encounters the old creation, and brings about transformation as well as restoration. The purpose of Christian Healing is to grant us entry into the Kingdom now, that we might live in the world, but not of the world. It is our invitation and access to God's Kingdom and the wholeness He has prepared for us.
