+ YOUTH: Ages 12-18 + LEADERS IN TRAINING: Ages 19-24 TEAM LEADERS: Ages 25 & up


The theme for this gathering is "We Belong" — because we belong to Christ, to the church, to our communities, and to each other!

Devotions: John opened with prayer. He asked us to share memories of church, why we joined, how did you get here? Colossians 3: 16 & 17 was a verse to live by. Discussion regarding how we can serve others and be fed in the word and our own journey. Pastor Pam closed with prayer.

Treasurer's Report: Jim submitted the report, but was unable to be present.

Cash Flow Report

Undesignated funds available to be used for July's General Fund expenses totaled \$15,840.02. This amount was only slightly less than the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$16,868.69. Congregational giving to the

Congregational giving to the General Fund was \$15,647.00. The monthly budget goal is \$20,221.69.

We ended the month at approximately 11.6% or \$28,300 under budget.

History of Regular Giving to the General Fund Report
July giving was up significantly

from June. July giving was the highest so far in 2023! In comparison to giving for July in other years, this is the highest since 2011.

Other Information

The library flooring got replaced last month!!

The lease on the office copier expired in July. I am recommending that the council approve a new agreement with Liberty. I will provide some information separate from this report for council's review.

I called Fertile Oil and got the propane rate set for the upcoming heating season. It is down from last year and will be \$1.35 this season. This will be a savings of \$0.54 per gallon from last season!!

Pastor's Report: Pastor Pam submitted the report.

Pastoral Care – I have made home as well as nursing care visits.

Nursing/Assisted Living services:

A new item is monthly communion service at Poplar Meadows, the 3rd Wednesday at 10:30. Leslie Tradewell has coordinated this for me. Mac Sr. Living next Wed. Aug 23 at 9 for a worship service & Fair Meadow Fri. Aug 18 at 10.

Education: Working with Nancy and Ann to choose curriculum for Released Time and Sunday School.

NALC Lutheran Week was out-

standing. It is good to a congregation in an doctrinally orthodox Lutheran church. We have reelected Bishop Dan Selbo. I was not elected to the NALC Executive Council, but did make it to the 3rd ballot. We have excellent pastors who are willing to serve. Check out the videos at www.thenalc.org.

Vacation Kevin and I will be gone for a week to Texas to see our son and family. Mike Sletto will be pulpit supply on September 3.

Worship: We will stay with our current setting through September but probably change one piece of it. I'd like feedback. We will return to LBW setting 2 as well as Blue book.

Healing service Seems to have been well received. We will work out pattern of flow. There are options.



2023 NALC Convention Report

The annual North American Lutheran Church (NALC) convention was held at the Oklahoma City Omni Hotel on 8-11 August. There 469 delegates in attendance. Approximately 2/3 of the 490 NALC congregations were represented. Grace Lutheran Church was represented by Pastor Pam Thorson, Gary Walters and Kevin Thorson. The 2024 NALC convention will be virtual. In 2025, the convention will be in Pittsburgh. theme for the convention was "Missio Dei: The Work and Mission of God. The business of the convention was routine. Bishop Dan Selbo was re-elected. The convention was broadcast live on FaceBook. Videos of each session are available at: https:// www.facebook.com/thenalc/

While Pastor Pam attended theological lectures, I attended the Faith Formation Festival. I was pleased to see it placed a great emphasis on youth. Rev. Teresa Peters (NALC's Director of Youth and Family Ministry) led lay and clergy participants in numerous workshops designed to inspire youth faith in Christ. The guest speakers did not focus on educating or teaching youth; instead they sought to share their and other participant's techniques used to inspire youth in their care. The featured speaker was Heather Ruesch, author of Sexual Mentality, Creating a Culture of Biblical Identity. I was particularly inspired by two quotes from her presentation/book.

In a culture that insinuates that parents are powerless and communicates that as a parent your values and input are meaningless and will have no impact, you need to hear the voice of truth, The truth is, Mom and Dad, YOU MATTER.

Don't let the message of 'Do what feels good' be the only voice our youth hear. We must find our voice and fulfill the calling that God has given us as parents, pastors, teachers, youth workers and those who care about teens. We must help our youth to maturity in each component of their life: physical, mental, emotional, social and spirituality.

During the convention, I attended the breakout session led by the Rev. Dr. Eric Riesen to discuss seminary and discernment a call for ministry.

The NALC seminary (hub at the North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS) in Pennsylvania with spokes at six seminaries in other states/province) appears to be working well.

The NALS has 3 new professors and a new Director of Vocational Discernment (Rev. Jeff Morlock).

In the last year, 26 congregations have called a pastor, but there are still 41 congregations still seeking a pastor. There are 37 pastors seeking a call and 30+ people discerning a call or attending seminary.

We are asking local citizens and churches to share this event. It is evident our youth are challenged by troubling life situations, many of them, out of their control. Desiring to educate, encourage and equip our youth, we are sponsoring a kick-off event for the upcoming Say Something Assembly School Tour coming to our area next spring.

Petitions will be gathered and letters sent to area schools and school boards, inviting them to book a spot on the School Tour. Say Something Assembly tackles tough topics like: bullying, addiction, exploitation and suicidal ideation among others-- in an upbeat, engaging format which connects with students.

September 10th, Caleb Monson, who coordinates Say Something Assembly School Tours in our region, will be joining us to share about their outreach and mission. We ask you to join us in educating, encouraging and equipping our area youth.

Proceeds will be used to provide matching funds to schools who book assemblies on the tour. Each assembly is \$1200. A school who books for both Middle School and High School would need \$2400 for the day. We want to match up to half of the fee of each assembly. Schools will be awarded matching funds on a first-come, first-serve basis.
