The F	-Iope	of	Faith

How beautiful it is to see the fields begin to green. It is the season of planting. There is a great deal of faith in this process. Fields are tilled, the soil prepared. Seeds are planted. All this with an expectation of a good harvest. That is faith. There is nothing that one can do to make seeds grow except to give the right conditions. It is God who has placed within the ability and sequence of growth — of life. Farmers, gardeners, too, have faith that something will grow. It's a matter of nurturing and of waiting.

Church Keys: Updating timing of locking doors and the use of the key cards.


New Business

Considering moving the wall in the library to increase size of a joining room.


Motion made to install TV's in each classroom. Passed. Limit \$2500.

Outdoor worship was discussed as part of the picnic on August 4th. Will look in feasibility.




