MINISTRY

With fall approaching, the Education Committee is again preparing for Release Time classes.

This is an important mission of our church. Last year we served over 80 students in grades 1-8.

The majority of these students are not members of Grace, and some are unchurched.

Elementary classes will begin on September 25, and Jr. High classes start on October 2nd.

Classes meet every other Wednesday for 45 minutes.

This year, we are looking for a 6th grade teacher, as well as substitute teachers. We use a curriculum with materials and easy to follow lesson plans. If you are considering being a

substitute teacher, you might be more comfortable coming up with your own lesson plan. For

example, we have noticed that our students are interested in stories about personal faith

journeys. If you have traveled to the Holy Land, have experience ministering at a homeless


shelter or jail, or have taken a mission trip, you could build a lesson around that.

Our roof is completed and so far no leaks have been seen! There is still work to be done to complete the education wing before Sunday School starts. Following is a short list of what needs to be completed.

- 1. Gutters on the South side of the education wing to direct water away from the building.
- 2. Landscaping on the south lawn to move water away from the building.
- 3. Insulation will be blown in after the electrical work is completed. This will have a major impact on our heating bills in the future.
- 4. Electrical work needed. The education wing was built in the 60's and the classrooms were not wired for power. While the roof is open we will have all our classrooms wired for power.
- 5. Plumbing leak outside of Kim's office repaired, along with heating register covers repaired in the classrooms.
- 6. Cover exposed pipes in the East classroom.
- 7. Move the wall in the library to make 2 large classrooms. This will require moving a light fixture and light switch.
- 8. Paint the ceilings of the classrooms that had walls taken out or moved.
- 9. Replace flooring in the classrooms that had walls taken out or moved.
- 10. We are getting bids to replace the carpet in the education wing. It is very old and worn, puckering in spots and has been rained on (leaked) many times.
- 11. Put a small AC unit in the Narthex.
- 12. Lights will be put in place behind the stain glass window in the sanctuary.

These updates will enable Grace Church to continue to use the Education Wing effectively for many years in the future.






