While we have endowments, we cannot rely on those to take care of our everyday needs. God always provides and we will continue to be faithful stewards of all we have.

Tina asked if we wanted individual giving reports to be sent out 3rd qtr. Council recommended Tina prepare the reports and send.

Treasurer's Report: Jim reported.

Building Fund Roof Repair
Fund – Another good month for donations.

Regular Offering to the General Operating Fund was \$15,657.25. Monthly budget goal is \$21,363.85.

Undesignated funds available to be used for September's General Fund expenses totaled \$16,076.41. This total is comprised of the regular offering,

interest, and a portion of other giving.

The total of undesignated funds was again below the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$24,240.88. However, the entire remaining portion of the property insurance premium was paid

(\$7,071.84) which distorts this

month's overall expenses. Without considering that, monthly expenses would total \$17,169.04. Expenses would have still exceeded undesignated funds for the month.

Noteworthy Other Giving:

Miscellaneous – Contribution by an area church to assist with release time transportation expenses from the last school year (\$200) and several pass-through donations.

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration: Church and Parsonage Property Taxes – Second half was paid.

Custodian – Brian's compensation was for the end of August and the first half of September.

Financial Secretary – Quarterly salary was paid.

Property Insurance – This expense is the normal monthly payment plus the remaining balance.

Worship: Worship Aids – Communion supplies and worship planning education materials.

Budget Report

We ended the month at approximately 10.2% or \$26,000 under budget.

All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

These items went over budget this month:

Property Insurance due to expensing a year and half of cost in one year:

Parsonage Property Taxes – expense was more than budgeted for the year.

<u>History of Regular Giving to the</u> <u>General Fund Report</u> Giving to date in 2024 continues to be well ahead of 2023 (\$12,000) and is the best ever at this time compared to any previous year!!

History of the General Operating Fund Balance

Total did not cover the month's expenses. General Operating Fund balance is down again from last month. Excluding the full insurance premium payment, the general fund balance would be at \$1,546.28. The General Operating Fund balance has continued to decrease since April, and September has the lowest General Operating Fund balance so far in 2024.

Account Balances Report
Building Fund - Reflects donations of \$105.00. It also reflects expenses related to the separate elevator phone line (\$39.33).
Oil Fund – Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.

Oil Fund – Church Operating Emergency Fund reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.

Oil Fund - Missions reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.

Organ Fund – Reflects a donation of \$5.00.

Roof Project Fund – Reflects donations of \$2,120.00 and expenses of \$1,652.31 (SS room painting), \$198.07 (materials for new wall in SS room), \$150.00 (gift certificate for Bursheim), and \$328.97 (loan interest). Scholarship Fund – Reflects a donation of \$10.00.

SS Equipment Fund – Reflects donations of \$25.00.
