Want to know how to Pray?

Prayer is communication with God. Simply, we can talk to God anytime and anywhere. The Almighty can hear our thoughts and knows the intentions of our hearts. We can pray out loud or silently. We can listen as Holy Spirit speaks to our hearts. There are many ways to pray. This ACTS method is an easy one to remember.

The ACTS prayer acronym stands for:

Adoration – praise for who God is. You are Wonderful. Almighty. Great. Holy. King of Kings. Lord of Lords. Ruler. Savior. Etc. ("Lord God in Heaven, You are worthy to be praised. You are the Creator and Sustainer of Life and from everlasting to everlasting You are God.")

Confession – tell your sins. Ask forgiveness for specific things. God forgives.

Thanksgiving – State those things that God has done for you.

Supplication – Ask for needs and concerns. Healing for the sick. Help wherever you or someone you know needs help. Pray for the world. Our community. Family. Nation. Weather. And so forth.

Hebrews 4:16 encourages us to "approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace for help at the time of our need" (NASB). So, here is a way that you can confidently come before God's throne to praise Him, repent, thank Him and request what it is you need.

What Is the ACTS Prayer Method?

This method of prayer serves as an outline or guide for prayer so you can organize your thoughts and requests. The acronym **ACTS** stands for adoration, confession, thanksgiving, and supplication.

Treasurer's Report:

Cash Flow Report

Regular Offering to the General Operating Fund was \$20,712.25,

a nice increase from last month! The monthly budget goal is \$21,363.85.

Undesignated funds available to be used for November's General Fund expenses totaled \$24,101.58. This total is comprised of the regular offering, interest, proceeds from the Deer Hunter's Supper, Love Offering, and other giving.

The total of undesignated funds given was above the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$17,272.79.

Noteworthy Other Giving: Love Offering - \$325.00 Deer Hunter's Supper -\$2,713.00

Operation Christmas Child - \$742.00

Some of the noteworthy expenses this month included:

Administration:

Church & Parsonage Fuel – The heating season has begun!! Church & Parsonage Maintenance – Fire extinguisher inspection comprises the bulk of this cost.

Custodian – Brian's compensation consists of only one request for payment.

Workers Comp – Annual premium.

Mission Outreach:

Miscellaneous – Pass through donations.

Budget Report

Overall, we ended the month at approximately 12.7% or \$32,500 under budget.

All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

The cleaning service line item went over budget this month.
They washed windows back in August, and this amount was not included in the budget. The

Workers Comp line item also went over budget this month due to the premium exceeding the budgeted amount.

<u>History of Regular Giving to the</u> <u>General Fund Report</u>

Giving in November increased nicely over giving in October and is the third month of increased giving since August.

This is the highest monthly giving for the year so far, and is actually the highest monthly giving ever since 2011!!

Giving to date in 2024 continues to be well ahead of 2023 (\$20,000).

Total giving for 2024 will be the highest for any year ever since 2011!!

<u>History of the General Operating Fund Balance</u>

Thanks to a nice increase in monthly giving, as well as donations for the Love Offering, the proceeds from the Deer Hunter's Supper; and a decrease in expenses this month; the previous negative balance in the General Fund is gone and we have a positive balance of \$4,213.39. This is the first positive General Fund balance since August. Account Balances Report Building Fund - Reflects donations of \$25.00. It also reflects expenses related to the separate elevator phone line (\$39.42) and the purchase of a vacuum cleaner to replace the vacuum of the church cleaner (\$236.00). Her vacuum was used by someone at the church and now it no longer worked well.

Oil Fund – Bldg Upkeep reflects a portion of this month's oil/gas revenue.
