

Treasurer's Report:

The monthly budget goal is \$22,077.10.

Undesignated funds available to be used for March's General Fund expenses totaled \$20,600.59. This total is comprised of the regular offering, interest, an anonymous gift, and various other giving.

The total of undesignated funds given were nicely above the month's General Fund expenses totaling \$18,172.77.

Budget Report

Overall, we ended the month at approximately 4.6% or \$11,900 under budget. All of the major budgeted expense categories ended under budget for the month.

<u>History of Regular Giving to</u> the General Fund Report

Giving in March was less than February, but still good. This is the best giving for a March since I started tracking giving in 2011. Well ahead of last year's to date giving. Best to date giving ever! <u>History of the General Operating Fund Balance</u>

Due to regular giving in March being good and extra other giving during the month, the negative ending balance for the General Fund decreased approximately \$2,800 since February. To date financial summary of roof project:

The food shelf is getting closer to our highest households of 50 in the year 2024. We had a total of 48 this month so far. 28 on the first shopping day and 20 on the second day.


Old Business:


