



News From The NALC


At the 2025 Mission Convocation (August 6–8 in Pittsburgh), delegates approved three amendments to the NALC Constitution. All NALC congregations are now asked to vote to ratify the amendments at their annual meetings.

Here are the three amendments (mainly administrative in nature):

1. Amendment One: Constitutional and Bylaws/Scrivener's Errors—Moves some constitutional language into bylaws and corrects editorial/scrivener's errors.

2. Amendment Two: Article on the North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS-)—Establishes the NALS formally in the Constitution, outlines structure (Center, Network, President, and Board of Regents).

3. Amendment Three: Article 16 — Legal and Financial Matters—Renames “Indemnification” to “Legal and Financial Matters,” expands it with fiscal year, handling of funds, approval of contracts, and valid notice. Grace will vote on ratification at our annual meeting January 25th. For more info go to the NALC website: <https://thenalc.org>



At the 2025 Mission Convocation, held August 6-8 in Pittsburgh, the North American Lutheran Church presented a renewed vision for our collective mission: to become a disciple-making church. This vision is realized as congregations are revitalized in faith, disciples are equipped to follow Jesus with assurance, and communities experience transformation through the power of the Gospel.

We envision a church body dedicated to making disciples by renewing congregations, equipping individuals, and transforming communities, all in faithful response to our calling and commission in Christ Jesus.

Four core values inform our beliefs and practices:

Christ Centered — We uphold the apostolic faith in Jesus Christ as revealed in Holy Scripture. We affirm the authority of Scripture as the definitive source and standard for faith and life—“according to which all doctrines should and must be judged” (Formula of Concord). We accept the ecumenical creeds and the Lutheran Confessions as accurate and faithful witnesses to the Word of God.

Mission Driven — We believe

that proclaiming the Gospel and making disciples for Christ constitute the essential mission of the Church. Advancing disciple-making within our congregations, throughout our communities and nations, and globally is our joyful vocation and urgent priority.

Traditionally Grounded —

We affirm the ecumenical creeds and the enduring testimony of the Church across the ages. We embrace the historic forms and practices of the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church, provided they are consistent with Scripture—especially the ministry of Word and Sacrament. We also pursue dialogue and fellowship with other Lutheran churches and all faithful Christians.

Congregationally Focused —

We are committed to organizing as a church body that supports local congregational ministries with a servant's heart and a spirit of partnership—offering resources, relationships, and shared wisdom for effective mission.

Nominating Committee will convene using guidelines.


Year-end reports due January 11


