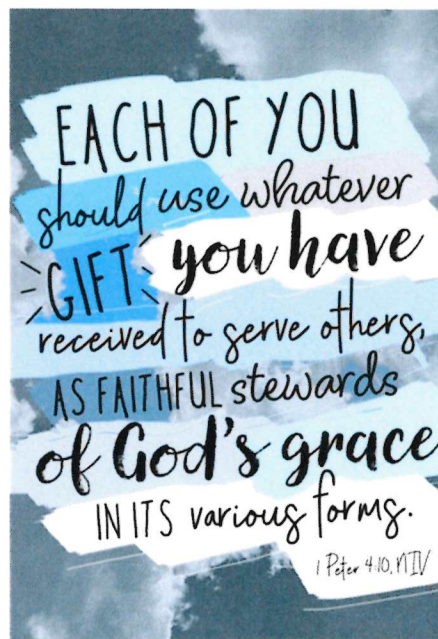

Reformation Sunday is October 25. We remember that the church stands on the Word of God, on Scripture Alone, in Christ Alone, by Grace Alone, through Faith Alone, and to the Glory of God Alone. The Altar is draped in red as a reminder of the work of Holy Spirit in the life of faith and the work of the Church.



The Confirmation Class is beginning the year with a study of the Apostles' Creed. What is this Creed and why do we recite it each Sunday in church? - The Statement of the Christian Faith was first set forth early in the history of the church. There were other statements passed on from the Apostles. An early version of what later became the Apostles' Creed, called the "Old Roman Creed," was in use as early as the second century. The Apostles' Creed is statement of Christian belief that is used by Western Catholic and Protestant churches. While it is explicitly affirmed only in Western churches, it reflects traditions that were affirmed officially by the entire Church in the Nicene Creed. Lutheran churches affirm 3 creeds: The Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed, and the Athanasian Creed.

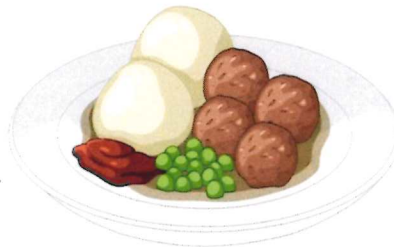

Stewardship

Stewardship of Joy

Explore Psalm 30, Psalm 150 and Song of Solomon.

Consider how joy fits into the full range of emotional experience. As well as how these emotional experiences informed the biblical writers' understanding of God's presence in their lives.

A woman came to [Jesus] with an alabaster jar of very costly ointment, and she poured it on his head as he sat at the table... [The disciples] were angry and said, "Why this waste? For this ointment could have been sold for a large sum, and the money given to the poor." But Jesus...said to them, "Why do you trouble the woman?...For you always have the poor with you, but you will not always have me" (Matthew 26:7-13).

This text invites us to wonder whether our ideas of stewardship are defined by frugality or extravagance-or both. Of course, it's understandable and even honorable to live prudently. But what if we were to include extravagance in our stewardship of joy?
